Iran puts 10 US individuals, CIA on its 'Terrorism List'

Iran's Foreign Ministry announces sanctions on a host of American individuals and entities for committing human rights violations, supporting terrorism and inciting violence against the Iranian nation during the recent riots. In a statement on Monday, the ministry said the sanctions were imposed in line with a law titled "Countering America's Human Rights Violation and Adventurous and Terrorist Actions" passed by the Iranian Parliament in 2017.

Iran is preparing to send additional weapons including ballistic missiles to Russia to use in Ukraine, western officials say

Iran is preparing to send approximately 1,000 additional weapons, including surface-to-surface short range ballistic missiles and more attack drones, to Russia to use in its war against Ukraine, officials from a western country that closely monitors Iran's weapons program told CNN. The shipment is being closely monitored because it would be the first instance of Iran sending advanced precision guided missiles to Russia, which could give the Kremlin a substantial boost on the battlefield.

Iran preparing 1,000 missiles and drones for shipment to Russia

Iran is preparing a massive arms shipment of 1,000 missiles and drones for Russia that will significantly aid Moscow's war in Ukraine, it has been reported. Russia's campaign will receive a major lift with the delivery of hundreds more kamikaze drones and, more worryingly, short-range ballistic missiles supplied by Tehran, experts told The National. It is understood that the consignment is being closely monitored by western intelligence services, particularly as it will be the first occasion that Iran has exported surface-to-surface missiles, potentially the Shahab or Zolfaghar weapons.

UNSC not to hold session on Iran

He made the remarks in response to the IRNA correspondent's question regarding the US attempt to hold a session on Iran's internal affairs. The issue of the Iran nuclear agreement (JCPOA) is discussed in the Security Council, but the situation in Iran is not reviewed by the Security Council. He noted that the sessions are not technically categorized as UNSC meetings. We follow the issue of Iran only at the national level and consider it within the framework of Iran's sovereignty, he stated.

He said that he will have a phone conversation later today with UN foreign policy chief Josep Borrell in which they will make the last coordination for the talks.

On the recent riots in Iran, the foreign minister said that the

harsh stance some European officials took on those riots resulted in violence in Europe too.

Exclusive: Iran is seeking Russia's help to bolster its nuclear program, US intel officials believe

Iran is seeking Russia's help to bolster its nuclear program, US intelligence officials believe, as Tehran looks for a backup plan should a lasting nuclear deal with world powers fail to materialize. The intelligence suggests that Iran has been asking Russia for help acquiring additional nuclear materials and with nuclear fuel fabrication, sources briefed on the matter said. The fuel could help Iran power its nuclear reactors and could potentially further shorten Iran's so-called "breakout time" to create a nuclear weapon.

Iran admits sending Russia drones

Iran admitted for the first time on Saturday that it has sent drones to Russia, but insisted they were supplied to its ally before the Russian invasion of Ukraine. "We supplied Russia with a limited number of drones months before the war in Ukraine," Foreign Minister Hossein Amir-Abdollahian said, quoted by the official news agency IRNA. Ukraine and its Western allies have accused Russia of using Iranian-made drones in recent weeks to carry out attacks in Ukraine. Tehran has repeatedly denied these claims. Iran has repeatedly denied that it has been supplying arms to Russia for use in the Ukraine war.

Iran says it gave drones to Russia before Ukraine invasion

Iran had previously refuted growing evidence it had sent drones and other weapons to Moscow. Mr Amirabdollahian denied that Iran had also sent missiles to Moscow and said Tehran will "react" if it is proven Iranian drones have been used by Russia in Ukraine.

Iran successfully launches Qaem 100 solid fuel suborbital carrier

The Aerospace Force of Iran's Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) successfully launched Qaem 100 three-stage solid fuel suborbital carrier. Qaem 100, the first of its kind manufactured by Iranian scientists, is capable of putting satellites weighing up to 80 kilograms into orbit 500 kilometers from the earth's surface. The launch vehicle's solid-fueled first-stage engine, which had been subjected to ground tests early this year, successfully completed its first suborbital spaceflight on Saturday. That means, according to IRGC officials, that Qaem 100 is now ready to launch Nahid, a satellite manufactured by Iran's Ministry of Information and Communications Technology, into orbit in the near future. Commander of the IRGC Aerospace Force Brigadier General Amir Ali Hajizadeh and other senior military officials supervised the flight test of the satellite carrier.

Iran unveils advanced home-made missile defense system

New edition of Iran's homegrown missile defense system, Bavar-373 with an extended engagement range of 300 kilometers, called Sayyad 4B was unveiled on Sunday in the presence of Iran's Defense Minister Brigadier General Mohammad Reza Ashtiani. The Sayyad 4B guided missile production line was inaugurated on Sunday. Iranian engineers have increased the range of the Bavar-373 long-range road-mobile surface-to-air missile system to 300 km. Bavar 373, as the first Iranian indigenous long-range defense system which was unveiled in August 2019, is a mobile missile defense system designed to intercept and destroy incoming hostile targets. The Bavar-373 air defense missile system is a product of creativity and reliance on internal capabilities in terms of design, development, and deployment of a strategic missile system.

Top military spokesman dismisses US, Ukraine allegations on Iran's role in war

Iran says it successfully tested satellite launch rocket

Iran touts hypersonic missile as UN atomic watchdog says uranium enrichment increases

The announcement came on the same day that UN nuclear watchdog, the International Atomic Energy Agency, said Iran had once again stepped up production of highly enriched uranium. Experts say Iran has enough highly enriched uranium to create a nuclear bomb, if it so desired. The IAEA also re-iterated in a recent report that Iran

had yet to co-operate in an inquiry into unexplained traces of uranium at three sites, which experts say points to a cover up of nuclear activities.

Iran envoy to UN says IAEA should act independently

Military chief: using Iranian drones in Tajikistan-Kyrgyzstan dispute unacceptable to Tehran

Pointing to the issue of delivering Iranian drones to Tajikistan, he stated that "Ababil 2" drones have only reconnaissance capability and are not equipped with weapons and offensive equipment. "The Iranian Armed Forces have always emphasized that the Tajik Armed Forces should not use 'Ababil 2' drones in the border disputes against Tajikistan," the top commander stressed.

Iran agrees to visit by UN's nuclear watchdog

Iran has reportedly agreed to a visit by the UN's nuclear watchdog this month as the International Atomic Energy Agency seeks answers on Tehran's continued uranium enrichment. The watchdog on Wednesday said Iran was further expanding its production of enriched uranium above levels prohibited under the abandoned 2015 nuclear deal. It has enough highly-enriched uranium to produce a nuclear bomb. The IAEA is set to hold its next quarterly board meeting next week, where western powers are expected to push for a resolution urging Tehran to co-operate. Concerns over Iran's

nuclear capabilities were further raised on Wednesday after it announced it had developed a hypersonic missile able to breach "all" missile defence systems.

IAEA watchdog expresses concern over Iran's nuclear programme

The International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) has expressed concern about the uncertainty around Iran's nuclear programme. "The longer the current situation persists, the greater such uncertainty becomes," IAEA chief Rafael Grossi said on Thursday. The agency has not been able to access data from its monitoring systems in Iran since the beginning of 2021, and last June it had to dismantle 27 cameras. Even with a return to

the earlier inspection mode, information would still be lacking, it said.

Iran's drones are unlikely to help Russia win in Ukraine — and could backfire for Tehran

Iran's drones have been used to brutal effect on Ukraine's civilian centers and critical energy infrastructure, as Russia's bombardment appears intent on making parts of the country unlivable as winter sets in. They have also been increasingly deployed by Russia's military as it runs low on its more advanced weaponry like guided missiles. The reason for those shipments centers on Iran pursuing strengthened relations with a key strategic ally, Russia; helping Moscow in its effort to combat Western hegemony; and enhancing its own role as a major weapons exporter.

Iran's weapons are slowly dragging Israel to Ukraine's defense

Netanyahu pressed on supplying weapons to Ukraine

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy was one of the first world leaders to congratulate Benjamin Netanyahu on his election victory, first on Twitter and then by phone. The call took place Nov. 7 and was friendly. Reports said Zelenskyy asked for Israeli arms and invited Netanyahu to visit Kyiv. Netanyahu reportedly promised to examine the arms issue once formally entering office. After this conversation, Zelenskyy tweeted again: “I had a phone call with Netanyahu. I expressed hope that the level of Ukrainian-Israeli interaction will correspond to the security challenges facing our countries.” Over the past few months Zelenskyy has often expressed his disappointment over Israel’s refusal to supply Ukraine with Iron Dome batteries against missiles and other weapons.

In a first, Israeli general opens up about use of armed drones

Israel on Wednesday described what has been an open secret for two decades – that it has used drones not just for surveillance but also in strikes within the country, against Palestinian militants in Gaza, and possibly targets as far away as Iran or Sudan. Israeli censors in July permitted publication of information about the armed drones and the chief of Israel’s artillery corps – which runs the drones together with the air force – used his speech at an industry forum to give what he described as a first public account of the armed versions of the pilotless planes. Whereas previously he could only offer hints, “today I can speak of this openly,” Brigadier-General Neri Horowitz told the annual UVID Drone Tech conference hosted by Israel Defense magazine in Tel Aviv.

About 70,000 bullets, 70 grenades stolen from army base in Golan heights

About 70,000 5.56 mm bullets and 70 grenades were stolen from an Israel Defense Forces base in the Golan Heights overnight Saturday, the military reported. Police confirmed that the Tznohar base was broken into and robbed of weaponry, and that six suspects have been arrested in connection with the case thus far.

According to inventory counts carried out at the base during the night, about 70,000 5.56 mm bullets and 70 grenades were taken from the site, among other things. The military reported that “The circumstances of the theft are being investigated by the Military Police, and at the end of the investigation, the findings will be handed over to the Military Advocate General for examination.”

Ukrainian army spotted using Israeli-made armored vehicles

They were parked along residential buildings in an unspecified village in the Kherson region and are believed to have taken a large part in Ukraine’s retaking of the city. While there is no information on how these vehicles appeared in the war-torn nation, Israel has made it clear that it would not supply military aid to Kyiv. The Middle Eastern country only agreed to send humanitarian aid and early warning systems due to “operational restrictions.”

While Israeli intelligence is trying to confirm Iran’s recent declaration that it has successfully developed a hypersonic ballistic missile, the Israeli Defense Forces have already been anticipating such an announcement — and in the last two months have begun accelerating efforts to develop measures to counter the potential new threat, sources say. Concerns about hypersonic weapons are not new, and Israel started work some years ago on developing the advanced Arrow-4 interceptor, once it

became clear that Iran was working to develop more versions of long-range missiles, including cruise missiles. But once Israeli intelligence confirmed that hypersonic missiles were on the wish list for Iran and assessed that Teheran was trying to get relevant technologies, especially from North Korea, a new push began to counter that threat.

Iran: holding successive UN meetings on chemical weapons file in Syria is evidence of politicization

He added that "the Syrian Government's move to submit a monthly report to the Director-General of the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW) on the details of the destruction of such weapons and their production facilities deserves to be appreciated."

Air strike on Iranian fuel tankers in Syria kills 15

An air strike late on Tuesday hit fuel tankers in Syrian territory shortly after they entered from Iraq, killing about 15 people, the UK-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said. The strike hit two of the eight tankers that entered from Al Qaim border crossing in western Iraq to Albu Kamal in Syria, a senior Iraqi official told The National. The vehicles were part of a 22-tanker convoy transporting fuel oil from Iran to Lebanon, he said. The convoy entered Iraq and then Syria legally in coordination between the governments.

Airstrikes on Syria-Iraq border target Iranian fuel convoy

Tension is rising again between Iranian-linked armed factions and the US after

airstrikes near the Syrian-Iraqi border targeted a fuel convoy shortly before midnight on Tuesday. No one claimed responsibility for the airstrikes, which killed more than ten people. Iraqi officials claim that the vehicles were carrying a legal shipment of fuel from Iran to Lebanon. Some reports claim that munitions were believed to be hidden in some of the vehicles. The attack reportedly occurred shortly after the first part of the convoy of over 20 vehicles entered Syrian territory from Iraq, near the city of Albu Kamal across from the Iraqi city of al-Qaim. Iranian state TV claimed the attack was carried out by US drones and helicopters after eight of 22 tanker trucks had crossed into Syria. Multiple reports suggest that at least some of those killed were Iranian nationals.

Syrian government aligned forces, islamic state battle in south

The fighting has caused casualties on both sides as well

as deaths and injuries among civilians and journalists.

Türkiye points to Kurdish militants for deadly Istanbul bombing

Ankara pointed the finger at the outlawed Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK) and its Syrian offshoot as the hand behind Sunday's bomb attack in a bustling pedestrian street in central Istanbul that killed at least six people and wounded 80. "Our assessment is that the order for the deadly terror attack came from Ayn al-Arab

[Kobani, a Kurdish-majority city in northern Syria], where the PKK/YPG has its Syrian headquarters," Suleyman Soylu, Turkey's iron-fisted interior minister, said early Monday. YPG refers to the People's Protection Units, the military wing of Syria's Kurdish Democratic Union Party (PYD). Turkey considers both the YPG and PYD terrorist groups and repeatedly urges its allies to sever ties with both. Within hours of Soylu's initial statement, the Istanbul police released footage of a house raid carried out in the early hours of Monday and announced that they had arrested a Syrian woman, Ahlam Albashir, who admitted to planting the bomb.

US Navy seizes 70 tonnes of missile fuel on ship from Iran to Yemen

More than 70 tonnes of ammonium perchlorate, a powerful oxidiser commonly used to make rocket and missile fuel, were found, as well as explosives, the Navy said. The US 5th Fleet stopped the vessel and its four Yemeni crew in international waters on November 8. It was the fleet's first ever ammonium perchlorate discovery.
