Comdr vows for deploying fast, advanced vessels at sea borders

Deputy Commander of Iran's Border Guards for Operations Brigadier General Jalal Setareh lauded advanced military facilities in border guards, saying that fast and advanced vessels will be deployed at sea borders. According to the military protocols in the border areas, the Iranian borders are monitored and controlled 24/7, Setareh said. He also hailed Iran's progress in scientific, technology, nuclear, defense, and medical fields. He referred to safeguarding borders and preventing smuggling as priorities of the Iranian border guards.

Iran, Saudi officials to hold talks in Jordan: report

The Lebanese online newspaper, El-Nashra, has claimed that a significant meeting will take place between Iranian and Saudi officials on the sidelines of the Iraq conference that will be hosted by Jordan. The second iteration of the Baghdad Conference for Cooperation and Partnership will take place on December 20 in Amman, Jordan, according to a report from El-Nashra. At the summit, Saudi Arabia, Turkey, Iran, and several more Arab nations are expected to attend. Some Lebanese sources have speculated that Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi and Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman will meet on the sidelines of the conference. The announcement comes while Iranian

officials have yet to confirm such a meeting.

AEOI chief says Iran's nuclear enrichment capacity has more than doubled

Head of the Atomic Energy Organization of Iran (AEOI) Mohammad Eslami said on Saturday that the country's nuclear enrichment capacity has more than doubled. Eslami made the remarks in a meeting with the members of Majlis (Iranian Parliament) Strategic Fraction. He said that a Strategic Action Plan passed by Majlis in 2020 was an appropriate law for the development of the country's nuclear industry. Implementation of this law raised Iran's enrichment up to a level that it has more than doubled that of the total history of the country's nuclear industry, the official said.

Iran offers IAEA a chance for getting over differences

A delegation from the UN nuclear watchdog is expected to arrive in Iran in the next few days in what appears to be another chance offered by Iran to the West to redress their past misbehavior. The visit comes amid a deadlock in both the talks over reviving the 2015 Iran nuclear deal and the negotiations between Iran and the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) over a safeguards

probe. Mohammad Eslami, the head of the Atomic Energy Organization of Iran (AEOI), has expressed hope the trip of the IAEA delegation would set Tehran and the Agency on a path to resolve the current outstanding issues. Speaking to reporters on Wednesday, Eslami voiced hope the upcoming visit of the International Atomic Energy officials to Tehran in the coming days can help resolve issues with the Agency. He said, "Our interactions with the Agency are underway and we hope a step forward be taken in the direction of addressing ambiguities and obstacles with the Agency."

N. Chief Hails Iran's Doubled Uranium Enrichment Capacity

Head of the Atomic Energy Organization of Iran (AEOI) Mohammad Eslami hailed the country's achievements in the nuclear field, and declared that Tehran's uranium enrichment capacity is currently twice more than the start of the industry in Iran. Eslami made the remarks in a meeting with a group of Iranian lawmakers on Saturday. He lauded the Iranian Parliament over passing the "strategic action" for lifting of the anti-Tehran sanctions and safeguarding the national interests, noting that "the law has contributed to the development of the country's nuclear industry". "The capacity for the enrichment of uranium in Iran is currently twice the total capacity since the beginning of the nuclear industry in the country," the nuclear head noted.

Halting more uranium enrichment depends on the opposite parties to fulfill their obligations. Iran will reduce the purity of its uranium enrichment whenever the sanctions are lifted.

AEOI Spokesman: Iran Continues 60% Uranium Enrichment

The Atomic Energy Agency of Iran (AEOI) Spokesman Behrouz Kamalvandi underlined Iran's continued uranium enrichment at the purity level of 60 percent, and stressed that Tehran continues nuclear research and development as well as production of new generations of centrifuge machines. Kamalvandi stated on Saturday that Iran's enrichment of uranium has officially reached the purity level of 60 percent in accordance with a parliamentary law seeking to accelerate the development of the Iranian nuclear program. The spokesperson made the remarks in a meeting with a number of Iranian lawmakers on Saturday, referring to the December 2020 law – dubbed the Strategic Action Plan to Counter Sanctions, which is aimed at countering sanctions and

promoting the country's peaceful nuclear program.

Iran Showcases First Domestic Dynamitron Accelerator

The Atomic Energy Organization of Iran (AEOI) unveiled a first homegrown industrial electrostatic accelerator device called "Dynamitron". AEOI Chief Mohammad Eslami and Iran's minister of higher education Mohammad Ali Zolfigol attended a ceremony in Tehran on Saturday to unveil the Dynamitron-type accelerator which has been developed and funded by Iran's Nuclear Science and Technology Research Institute (NSTRI). The Dynamitron is an electrostatic particle accelerator used to generate a high DC voltage on an electrode, which accelerates particles through an evacuated beam tube between the electrode and a target at ground potential. Dynamitron accelerator device has applications in the field of food irradiation, sterilization of medical equipment, wire and cable irradiation, tire irradiation, foam and heat shrinkable material irradiation, sewage irradiation, ion implantation, ion beam analysis, and neutron generator in boron neutron capture therapy (BNCT).

4 Security Forces Martyred in Clashes with Terrorists in Southeast Iran,

Militants Flee toward Pakistan

The Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) announced that four Iranian security forces have been martyred in a terrorist attack in Southeastern Iran on Monday. An officer of the IRGC and three members of the Basij volunteer force have been killed in clashes with terrorists who opened fire on them in Sistan and Baluchestan province close to the border with Pakistan. The IRGC Ground Force's Quds Base said in a statement on Monday that Second Lieutenant Mohammad Gouradzi and three Basij members, identified as Rahim Bakhshparaki, Hamidreza Abedi and Mahmoud Nikkhaah, lost their lives when IRGC forces engaged in a fierce exchange of fire with terrorists in the Saravan region of the province.

Iran Dismantles Mossad Espionage Network Planning to Sabotage Defense Industry

Iran's Intelligence Ministry announced that the country's security agents captured the members of a Mossad spy network who were planning to sabotage Iran's defense industry. Iran's intelligence forces uncovered a plot by a Mossad espionage network to gather information from Iranian knowledge-based companies that cooperate with Iran's defense industries. The Israeli regime's Mossad spy agency hired data broker Frank Genin, who introduced himself as the chief of a spare parts manufacturer company and was able to contact several Iranian companies and employees, according to a report. The Mossad agent then invited his coworkers to a seminar in Malaysia, where he introduced them to another Mossad agent, Hadrien Lavaux.

Iran ready to resume Vienna talks: Envoy

Vienna over reviving the 2015 Iran nuclear deal. The United Nations Security Council held a non-proliferation meeting on December 19. The meeting, titled "Non-Proliferation: Implementation of Security Council resolution 2231 (2015)," was designed to take stock of the latest about Resolution 2231 which endorsed the 2015 Iran nuclear deal, officially known as the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA). In the meeting, the Council members once again expressed their support for the JCPOA's restoration and called for its full implementation as the only viable course of action. Iravani pointed out that the JCPOA can only be restored by addressing the root causes of its current situation, that is the U.S. withdrawal therefrom on 8 May 2018.

Nuclear Chief: Iran to Turn into Global Hub for Deuterium Drugs in Near Future

Head of the Atomic Energy Organization of Iran (AEOI) Mohammad Eslami said that Tehran is seeking to become a deuterium drugs hub in the world. Eslami made the remarks in a ceremony to inaugurate a modern gamma knife radiosurgery facility in Tehran on Sunday. "In a not too distant future we will turn into a hub for manufacturing drugs based on deuterium which are good alternatives to chemical drugs and have lower side effects in comparison (to those drugs)," he stated. The nuclear head added the AEOI will continue to provide technologies and equipment to domestic suppliers to help them in their efforts to manufacture sophisticated drugs and medical appliances. Researchers believe deuterium, which is a heavy isotope of hydrogen, can substantially improve the metabolic properties of medicines and make them more effective by forming a stronger chemical bond to a carbon atom of a molecule used in drugs.

Russia set to supply Iran with Su-35 fighter jets 'in near future'

The Islamic Republic of Iran will soon receive a full squadron of Sukhoi Su-35 fighter planes from Russia, a move that is certain to further enrage the West as Tehran and Moscow strengthen their defense and economic collaboration in defiance of broad sanctions and draconian measures. According to media sources quoting military specialists, Iran will soon get 24 of the fourth-generation twin-engine, super-maneuverable fighter jets that are mostly used for air dominance missions. Some of the combat aircraft are anticipated to be housed at TAB 8 of the Islamic Republic of Iran Air Force (IRIAF), which is located in the Iranian city of Isfahan in the country's center. Based on Russia's United Aircraft Corporation (UAC), the Sukhoi Su-35 fighter jet "combines the qualities of a modern fighter (super-maneuverability, superior active and passive acquisition aids, high supersonic speed and long range, capability of managing battle group actions, etc.) and a good tactical airplane (wide range of weapons that can be carried,

modern multi-channel electronic warfare system, reduced radar signature, and high combat survivability).”

Official: Iran Planning to Produce Medicines Using Heavy Water

Head of the Atomic Energy Organization of Iran (AEOI) Mohammad Eslami hailed the country's progress in the pharmaceutical field using the nuclear knowledge, and said that Tehran is seeking to manufacture drugs from heavy water derivatives. Speaking to reporters on the sidelines of the cabinet meeting on Wednesday, Eslami referred to Iran's efforts to boost the application of nuclear technology in the medical sector and treatment of patients suffering from cancer. The top nuclear official said the country is working on plans to produce medicine based on heavy water. "Annually, one million patients benefit from the country's capacities in the field of radiopharmaceuticals," he noted. The only Iranian company in the field of radiopharmaceutical production in the world is sanctioned, he continued, stating that it shows that people's lives have no value for sanctions.

Iranian Army to Hold Massive Military Exercises in Hormuz Strait, Indian Ocean

Iran's Army will start large-scale drills across a zone stretching from the Eastern side of the Hormuz Strait in the Persian

He added that the infantry and armored units as well as mechanized regiments of the Army's Ground Force, air defense systems, subsurface, surface and flying vessels and rangers of the Navy will participate. Strategic bombers of the Air Force will also provide logistical support.

Latest Islamic State attack highlights security challenges facing Iraq

At least nine members of the Iraqi security forces were killed and three others were wounded on Sunday in a bomb attack targeting their convoy in the Kirkuk governorate of northern Iraq. The Islamic State (IS) immediately claimed responsibility via its Telegram account. The attack took place near Safra, a village about 20 miles south of Kirkuk in the Kurdistan Region. Immediately following the explosion, a clash broke out between security forces and IS militants, leading to the killing of one IS member. The area is located near the borders of the Salahuddin and Diyala provinces, and the nature of the terrain — with desert plains and mountains — provides a safe haven for the terrorist organization.

Yazidis in Iraqi Kurdistan face 'extinction,' community leaders say

In a barren roadside expanse under a clear winter sky, young boys dream of being the next Messi as they kick a soccer ball around. The girls beguile visitors, cupping their thumbs and index fingers to make heart signs and sharing their hopes of becoming doctors and lawyers one day. Yet there are few such prospects for these children at the Sharya camp for Yazidis, the ethnic Kurdish minority whose men were butchered and women and girls raped and enslaved by the Islamic State (IS) when it swept across their ancestral homeland of Sinjar in 2014. Hazi, 13, says she has lived here with her six brothers and five sisters for eight years. "Life is very difficult," she told Al-Monitor. "Our tents keep getting damaged. In summer it is like hell and in winter the tents are wet and cold." "We are afraid Daesh will return," chimed in Hayo, 12, using the Arabic language acronym for IS. She wants to be a dentist, she said.

Iraqi air force kills 5 terrorists with an air strike in Tal Afar

The statement added, "The operation resulted, according to preemptive intelligence, in the killing of (5) terrorists, one of whom was a leader of the terrorist ISIS gangs."

Rasool added that "the commander-in-chief issued during the ministerial security meeting an order to tighten the zero point between Iraq, Syria and Iran by the Iraqi forces and support them logistically," pointing to "continuing to build the capabilities of the armed forces."

Airstrike On Syria-Iraq Border Demonstrates Long Reach Of Israeli Airpower

Forbes, December 17, 2022

On Nov. 8, an airstrike struck a convoy of trucks crossing from Iraq into Syria near Al-Qaim. Israeli Lt. Gen. Aviv Kochavi later confirmed Israel's involvement when he said Israeli warplanes had hit "specific targets" in a convoy "passing from Iraq to Syria." Kochavi credited military and

intelligence with giving the IAF the ability to strike with such precision. Without these capabilities, he stressed, Israel “could have not known a few weeks ago about the Syrian convoy passing from Iraq to Syria. We could have not known what was in it, and we could have not known that out of 25 trucks, that was the truck. Truck No. 8 is the truck with the weapons.” That lone vehicle was determined by “perfect intelligence” to contain Iranian weaponry. Initial reports after the attack suggested it killed 14 members of Iran’s Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) and allied militiamen. The arms were destined for Iran-backed militias in Syria’s eastern Deir ez-Zor province.

The rocket launchers, originally manufactured in Czechoslovakia under the designation RM-70, were procured by Finland in 1991 in a quantity of 36 pieces from former East German stocks, of which 34 pieces are probably still in use. The wheeled RAKH 89 M1 is equipped with 40 pieces of 122mm tubes and is used by Finland in support of mechanized and motorized units. The system's original 122mm rockets have a range of around 20 km, while versions that are more modern increase this to around 30 km.

Israel could strike in Lebanon if Iran renews weapons smuggling

The latest round in this ongoing campaign was prompted by Israeli concerns over Iran's suspected intention to launch an aerial smuggling route from Tehran to Beirut using civilian flights of Meraj Airlines, operated by Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps, which started direct flights from Tehran to Beirut in mid-November.

Macron has taken the lead in international efforts to bail out the Lebanese economy after a collapse in the value of the Lebanese pound plunged most of the population into poverty. International lenders have demanded that Lebanon adopt a programme of painful economic reforms in return for releasing billions of dollars in bailout loans.

Why Saudis Don't Want to Pivot to China

Chinese President Xi Jinping just returned from three days of back-to-back summits in Riyadh: the first with Saudi Arabia's King Salman and Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, the second with leaders of the Gulf Cooperation Council, and the third with a larger group of Arab governments. The result of the summit marathon was a number of public and not-so public agreements on energy, trade, investment, technology cooperation, and various other areas. The summits ratified an increasingly close economic and security relationship. Saudi Arabia supplies China with 18 percent of its energy needs, and it is expanding orders for petrochemical, industrial, and military equipment, much of which it previously obtained from the United States. The White House, meanwhile, said Xi's attempt to expand Chinese influence in the Persian Gulf region is "not conducive to maintaining international order." Commentators described Xi's visit as a sign that Riyadh is abandoning its traditional relationship with Washington and pivoting to Beijing.

In a statement issued yesterday, the public prosecution said that anyone who causes or may cause the death or serious injury of a person or severe damage to property or the environment would be subjected to a fine up to SR30 million, and jail term for a period of 10 years. The Public Prosecution clarified that the nuclear material is plutonium or uranium-233, or uranium-233 or uranium-235, in addition to the uranium containing a mixture of isotopes which are found in nature.

Akinci UCAV test-fires Türkiye's 1st air-to-ground supersonic missile

Developed with domestic resources, Türkiye's first air-to-ground supersonic missile, the TRG-230, hit its target with pinpoint accuracy at a distance of 100 kilometers (62 miles) in a recent test. The TRG-230 air-to-ground missile, developed by Roketsan under the coordination of the Presidency of Defense Industries (SSB), was fired from Baykar's landmark Akinci unmanned combat aerial vehicle (UCAV), according to the missile-developing company. The Akinci, which took off from a base in northwestern Tekirdağ province's Çorlu district and covered a distance of about 700 kilometers off the northern Black Sea province of Sinop, hit its target over 100 kilometers away. The feat marks the first ballistic supersonic missile launched from air to ground in Türkiye.

UAV, ammo sales to carry Turkish defense exports to new highs

The Turkish defense industry is set to break new export records this year with growing unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) and ammunition sales. The export momentum, achieved in the sector in recent years, was maintained in 2022 with Presidency of Defense Industries (SSB) coordination, defense and aerospace export data revealed.

The foreign sales of the defense and aerospace industry, which was \$2.7 billion (TL 50.39 billion) during last year's 11 months, increased by 35.7% and reached \$3.7 billion. The share of defense exports was 68.9%, while that of civil aviation stood at 20.3%. The 12-month export performance of the defense sector is projected to reach \$4.2 billion with an increase of 37.4%. If the sector carries its performance to the last month of the year, the export target of \$4 billion will be achieved with a new annual export record.

Bull's eye: Turkish combat drone Akıncı test-fires new-gen guidance kit

Türkiye's landmark combat drone has undergone a firing test with a new generation guidance kit, achieving yet another milestone in the integration process of domestically manufactured precision guidance systems and ammunition. Türkiye's UCAV Akıncı test-fires with Aselsan's laser guidance kit

Türkiye's cutting-edge unmanned combat aerial vehicle (UCAV) Bayraktar Akıncı, bearing a Turkish defense giant Aselsan-made CATS camera, has test fired with an Aselsan laser guidance kit, hitting the target with pinpoint accuracy. The drone's developer Baykar shared the development on Twitter. The laser guidance kit was integrated with a MK-82 bomb, also developed by Aselsan, and was used in the test firing. The kit converts 227-kilogram (500-pound) MK-82 and 2-ton MK-84 dumb bombs into cost-effective and highly reliable smart weapons. According to the company, it provides increased accuracy, delivery range, reduced collateral damage and after-release re-targeting capability against both stationary and moving targets.
