What does the India-Iran Chabahar port deal mean for Armenia?

On May 13, 2024, Iran and India signed a historic deal under which New Delhi was granted the right to develop and operate the Iranian port of Chabahar on the Gulf of Oman. Armenia would also benefit from this agreement. In January 2024, Iran granted access to Armenia to operate in its Chabahar and Bandar Abbas ports to facilitate trade with India. Following the 2020 Artsakh War, Armenia aimed to diversify its security partners and turned to India for defence cooperation and arms purchases. Tehran and New Delhi have been supporting Yerevan's aspiration to assist in developing and using Iran's ports. In 2023, Armenia's former deputy Foreign Minister Mnatsakan Safaryan said that the Chabahar port is an integral component in Armenia's quest to have access to Indian and Asian markets via the International North-South Transport Corridor (INSTC).

Armenia and Azerbaijan step up work on peace deal

On May 10 and 11, the foreign ministers of Armenia and Azerbaijan, Ararat Mirzoyan and Jeyhun Bayramov, respectively, met for another round of bilateral peace negotiations in Almaty, Kazakhstan. It was the second meeting this year between the two sides after the meeting in Berlin on February 28 and 29. One significant agreement came in choosing which maps to use for the delimitation process. Previously, the two countries were on opposite sides of the issue. Armenia proposed using a Soviet map drawn in 1975, while Azerbaijan insisted that the new boundaries not be based solely on one map. The location of Almaty for the talks was symbolic in this context as the Alma-Ata Declaration was signed in 1991.

Once strategic partners, Armenia and Russia have fallen out amid accusations by Yerevan that the Kremlin did not fulfil its obligations to defend Armenian security interests during the Second Karabakh War. Officials in Yerevan announced May 29 the suspension of broadcasts by Russia's state-owned broadcaster, Channel One, ostensibly citing unpaid debts to the Armenian agency that controls digital frequencies. But the move appeared to have a political connection too.

According to the statement, a protocol on the results of the consultations was signed, which approved a cooperation plan between the defence ministries of India and Armenia for 2024-2025, and provided for the establishment of a joint working group on the issues of bilateral defence cooperation.

Russian troops leave Karabakh, now back under Azerbaijan's control

Russia shut down a military base in Azerbaijan on May 15, 2024 where nearly 2,000 of its troops had been deployed, after Azeri forces recaptured the area last year despite a two-year Russian mission to prevent war between Azerbaijan and Armenia. A total of 1,960 Russian peacekeepers had been housed in 10 barracks at the base in Khojaly, a town in the Karabakh region. Despite the deployment. Azerbaijan recaptured Karabakh in a lightning offensive last September, prompting an exodus of 100.000 ethnic Armenians who had enjoyed de facto independence since breaking away in the 1990s in the first of two wars between the South Caucasus neighbours.

The sale of Pakistani fighter jets to Azerbaijan has been the subject of recurring speculation since 2007; the story resurfaced on 21 February 2024. According to the Centre for European Policy Analysis (CEPA), Azerbaijan's largest supplier of arms has historically been Russia. The JF-17 Block III (Thunder) is a joint venture between China Aviation Industry Corporation (AVIC) and the Pakistan Aeronautical Complex (PAC). Chinese systems make the aircraft a system with a claim to 4.5 generation credentials. Pakistan's offer appears to be a qualitative leap forward compared to Azerbaijan's current fleet and will transform the nature of aerial combat in the Caucasus.

'Iran staging itself to reach [Nuclear] Goal in 1 or 2 Weeks,' Experts tell TML

Rafael Grossi, head of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), the UN's nuclear oversight organisation, flew to Iran last week to strengthen the UN's supervision of Iranian nuclear activities. Iran has agreed to provide the agency with information about its nuclear facilities and access to cameras at its nuclear sights. Since 2022, many surveillance cameras have been removed, and traces of uranium have been found in unexpected locations. In 2018, Donald Trump's administration decided to withdraw from the 2015 nuclear deal between Iran and the US. Under the deal, Iran agreed to limit its uranium stockpile and enrich uranium only to 3.67%, the purity needed to run nuclear power plants. In return, Iran received relief from sanctions imposed by the US, the EU, and the UN Security Council.

The death of Iran's President could change the world

The uncertainty ushered in by the death of Iran's president, Ebrahim Raisi, in a helicopter crash, just weeks after an unprecedented exchange of military attacks with Israel, has brought a chilling question to mind: Is 2024 the year that Iran finally decides it can no longer take chances with its security and races to build a nuclear bomb? Even before Mr. Raisi's death, there were indications that Iran's position might be starting to shift. The recent exchange of hostilities with Israel, a country with an undeclared but widely acknowledged nuclear arsenal, has provoked a change of tone in Tehran. "We have no decision to build a nuclear bomb but should Iran's existence be threatened, there will be no choice but to change our military doctrine," Kamal Kharrazi, a leading adviser to Iran's supreme leader, said on May 9.

While Iran's nuclear program stands at the precipice of tipping over into enriching uranium at weapons-grade levels, Tehran has held quiet, indirect talks with the United States and invited the head of the United Nations' atomic watchdog into the country for negotiations. Tehran is attempting to exert its own version of Trump's "maximum pressure" on the international community to see the economic sanctions that have crippled the country's economy and currency lifted in exchange for slowing down its program. The Islamic Republic also appears to be trying to contain the risk it faces from the U.S. after launching an unprecedented attack on Israel amid its war on Hamas in the Gaza Strip.

Iran's near-bomb-grade uranium stock grows, talks stall, IAEA reports say

Iran is enriching uranium to close to weapons-grade at a steady pace while discussions aimed at improving its cooperation with the U.N. nuclear watchdog are stalled, two confidential reports by the watchdog showed on May 27, 2024. The International Atomic Energy Agency faces a range of difficulties in Iran, including the fact it only implemented a small fraction of the steps IAEA chief Rafael Grossi thought it committed to in a "Joint Statement" on cooperation in 2023. Grossi travelled to Iran this month for talks with Iranian officials aimed at improving cooperation and IAEA monitoring in Iran. Follow-up talks have stalled, however, after the death of Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi in a helicopter crash earlier in May, 2023.

Iran's nuclear threat escalates as US, European allies appear at odds

In the ever-intricate dance of international diplomacy, tensions between the US and its European allies are reportedly intensifying over how to address Iran's advancing nuclear program. Earlier in May 2024, a confidential report by the UN nuclear watchdog - and seen by several news agencies - painted a starker image of Tehran's nuclear ambitions. It revealed that Iran's stockpile of uranium enriched to 60% purity had surged to 142.1 kilograms, edging close to weapons-grade levels. The increase, a significant jump from previous reports, not only underscores Iran's ongoing advancements in its nuclear capabilities but also intensifies the public pressure on the West to counter Tehran's accelerating nuclear efforts.

Security Council to end UN Iraq mission next year

The Security Council said in a resolution issued that it took note of the Government of Iraq's letter dated 8 May 2024 and decided to extend UNAMI's mandate for a final 19month period until 31 December 2025 after which UNAMI will cease all work and operations except with respect to any remaining liquidation of the Mission.

Israeli airstrikes on Syria kill one girl, three Hezbollah fighters

The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights war monitor said an Israeli strike on central Syria on Wednesday killed three Syrian fighters working with Lebanon's Hezbollah group. Syria's defence ministry and state media said another Israeli strike killed a girl in the coastal city of Baniyas and wounded 10 civilians. "The Israeli enemy launched an air attack from the direction of Lebanon, targeting a central site and a residential building in Baniyas city in the coastal region, killing a girl and wounding 10 civilians," a ministry statement said. Israel has carried out hundreds of strikes in Syria since the outbreak of the civil war in its northern neighbour, mainly targeting army positions and Iran-backed fighters including from Hezbollah. Syria's war has killed more than half a million people and displaced millions more since it erupted in 2011 after Damascus cracked down on anti-government protests.

Despite the IDF's retaliatory strikes, LH and Palestinian militants continue to launch projectiles targeting northern Israeli areas. Israeli retaliatory fire has impacted sites across southern Lebanon. Cross-border fire and Israeli airstrikes continue to target military sites deep inside Syria and increasingly inside Lebanon. Additional Israeli military forces have deployed to the northern border.

Turkish defence firm to provide Nigeria with 'system of systems' to secure north

In northern Nigeria, authorities have long been trying to face down threats posed by terrorist groups, insurgents, and armed gangs known locally as bandits. Integrating groundbreaking Turkish defence industry products under a multimillion-dollar project, Asisguard will be providing Nigeria with a so-called "system of systems" to secure the road spanning from the capital Abuja to the city of Kaduna, roughly 160 kilometres (100 miles) north. This project is the first of its kind in the West African nation, set to be handed over to Nigerian authorities by the end of 2024 as part of the project, Nigeria will be receiving an assortment of Turkishmade defence equipment, according to Duzgun. These include Baha drones manufactured by Ankara-based defence firm Havelsan, as well as mini-spotter unmanned aerial systems called the Togan by STM, armoured Yoruk 4x4 trucks by Nurol Makine, components of Songar armed drones from Asisguard and other products from about 10 other Turkish subcontractors., Asisguard's General Manager Baris Duzgun told Anadolu.

Turkey considers the Kurdish-led Syrian Democratic Forces, the armed wing of the autonomous administration in northern Syria, a threat to its national security due to its ties with the Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK), the militant group fighting for Kurdish selfrule inside Turkey.

The regulation explains that a will national mobilisation become effective with its publication and will be presented for the approval of parliament the same day. The new regulation makes an important amendment to the issue of purged public workers, including soldiers, who were dismissed following the 2016 failed coup attempt. These purged public workers can now be classified as substitute soldiers in times of national emergency.

Yemen's Houthi rebels say they've downed another US drone

Yemen's Houthi rebels on May 17, 2024 claimed to have shot down an American drone, hours after footage circulated online of what appeared to be the wreckage of an MO-9 Reaper drone. Early on May 18, 2024, a vessel also came under attack the Red Sea. Houthi military in spokesperson Brig. Gen. Yahya Saree claimed that rebels shot down the Reaper on Thursday with a surface-to-air missile. He described the drone as "carrying out hostile actions" in Yemen's Marib province, which remains held by allies of Yemen's exiled, internationally recognized government. The Houthis later released footage they claimed showed the surfaceto-air-missile being launched at night, along with night-vision footage of the missile hitting the drone.

The Red Sea attacks highlight the erosion of US leadership in the region

Six months after the Joe Biden administration launched Operation Prosperity Guardian to ensure freedom of navigation in the Red Sea, the biggest issue facing the White House is not the Houthi threat but the US failure to rally partners and allies behind its leadership. Fortunately, since the Houthis waged their attacks on ships crossing the Red Sea, US forces have succeeded in intercepting projectiles fired from Yemen. The European operation faces its own issues, particularly regarding the modest naval capabilities provided by the contributing nations. As of today, the operation merely relies on four warships to counter Houthi attacks. Europeans also suffer from limited air-defense capabilities. The French Navy has repeatedly used Aster 30 surface-to-air missiles to counter multiple Houthi ballistic missiles.
