Armenia

Minister of High-Tech Industry visits Aragats defence contractor

Minister of High-Tech Industry Mkhitar Hayrapetyan has visited the headquarters of defence contractor Aragats LLC. The company was founded in 1992 and the development specializes in production of military-grade electronic CEO devices. Aragats Hovhannes Gharibvan briefed the minister on the latest reforms and industrial volumes of the company, the ministry said in a press release. The defence contractor developed and produced the thermal imaging device for the 9K111 Fagot antitank missile system. The cost of the device approximately four times compared to similar ones produced in other countries, while the quality is on the highest level. Gharibyan said that the entire production of Aragats is in service in the Armenian Armed Forces, and that the company's capacity has enabled them to consider starting exports.

Azerbaijan makes new provocation, accusation against Armenia

The Azerbaijani media, citing the joint statement by the General Prosecutor's Office and the State Border Service and the National Agency for Mine Action (ANAMA) of Azerbaijan, report about the explosion of a landmine in one of the territories recently transferred by Armenia. "On August 2, the landmines planted by the Armenian side exploded in the village

of Gizilhajili, Gazakh district," the Azerbaijani media reported. As a result of the explosion, an ANAMA employee was wounded in the legs, and two more of its employees sustained shrapnel wounds. They were hospitalized, and their injuries are not life-threatening. It is about the former part of the Armenia-Azerbaijan border where landmines were used on both sides. Now, however, Azerbaijan presents it as "landmines planted by Armenia" and uses this incident for provocations and accusations.

Indian Defence Research Wing: first Indian Akash-1S SAMs to arrive in Armenia by the end of the year

The first Indian Akash-1S surface-to-air missile systems will arrive in Armenia by the end of this year, Indian Defence Research Wing reports. According to the publication, Yerevan has ordered 15 units of these air defence systems at a cost of \$720 million. Armenia will be the first foreign buyer of these Indian systems. The Akash-1S systems utilize a combination of simultaneous active target acquisition and guidance, providing a robust defense against airborne threats such as fighter jets, guided missiles and drones. "The Akash-1S was developed in 1983 and adopted into service 30 years later. It can shoot down aerial targets within a range of 4 to 25 kilometers. The acquisition of this advanced air defence system is expected to significantly increase Armenia's military potential. The successful production and imminent delivery of Akash 1S Armenia underscores India's growing role

in defense technology and its status as a major global arms exporter.

Iran seeks to deepen military ties with Belarus

Top defence officials from Iran and Belarus have held talks in Tehran on the establishment of a commission for military cooperation between the two countries, Iranian state media reported. The August 1 meeting between Mohammad Bagheri, the head of the General Staff of Iran's Armed Forces, and visiting Belarusian Defence Minister Viktor Khrenin took place one day after Tehran and Minsk signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) in the field of defence cooperation. Speaking

at the meeting, Bagheri said that "defence and security cooperation" between the two countries "should be expanded today in response to the changes that are taking place in the global power structure." "The world's geopolitical landscape is swiftly transitioning from a unipolar state to a multipolar world," he added. On July 31, Khrenin and his Iranian counterpart, Defence Minister Mohammad Reza Ashtiani, oversaw the signing of the MOU to cooperate in the field of defence.

IRGC Navy receives 2,640 missile systems, drones

In a ceremony in the presence of the commander-in-chief of the Islamic Revolutionary Guards Corps (IRGC) on 9 August, 2,640 missile systems, drones and other equipment were handed over to the IRGC Naval Combat Organization. The missiles were cruise missiles with new capabilities, such high-explosive as warheads and undetectability, each of which can cause severe damage and sink enemy destroyers. There were various types of long-range, medium-range radar evading missile systems, combat drones, detection and destruction, electronic warfare systems, naval radars and other combat equipment, of which only 210 of the 2640 systems were displayed.

IRGC can reach US Navy at closest point in international waters

"After the United States imposed sanctions on the IRGC Navy, we had to show that the IRGC Navy is not just a coastal force and is capable of supplying various types of heavy vessels, enabling it to have a presence in international waters," Colonel Soleimani said on August 12. He added that the naval fleet, with a domesticallydeveloped Shahid Mahdavi oceangoing warship acting as the flagship, began its mission from Farsi Island in the Persian Gulf where the US martyred an IRGC commander. "This conveyed important messages to the US," he emphasized, according to PressTV. During its mission, the Shahid Mahdavi warship passed through important and strategic straits of the world, including the Strait of Malaga, he added. The IRGC commander said the Iranian flotilla crossed the Equator and entered the zone of the US Navy's 7th fleet. For the first time, it approached Diego Garcia Island and one of the most important US bases in the Indian Ocean, and returned home after 39 days of successful voyage, he added."We sent a message to Americans that we are able to reach the closest point to you," Soleimani asserted.

Attack on US troops in Iraq highlights escalating Middle East tensions

Iraq seeks weaning off Iranian energy with a new link with Turkiye

The new Iraqi-Turkish power line is a part of Baghdad's broader strategy to diversify its energy resources and reduce its reliance on Iranian gas and electricity, a new article by the Middle East Institute suggested on August 8. On July 21, 2024, Baghdad inaugurated the new power line connecting Türkiye and Iraq to handle Turkish electricity imports. This 115-kilometer (71-mile) transmission line is expected to deliver 300 megawatts of energy to a power station west of Mosul with the aim of supplying northern Iraq, including the regions of Nineveh, Salahuddin, and Kirkuk.

Israel moves to strengthen defence production amid boycott calls

Israel has reached an agreement with Elbit Systems on an NIS 815 million — approximately \$215 million in U.S. currency — contract to supply the country's military with 120mm "Iron Sting" mortars, the Israeli Ministry of Defence and Elbit Systems announced on July 29. The mortar munitions are already in use by the IDF's ground forces in the ongoing "Iron Swords" war in Gaza and along its northern border against the militant groups Hamas and Hezbollah,

respectively. Israel's agreement with the Haifa-based Elbit Systems comes as part of a push to strengthen production independence, the Israeli Ministry of Defence noted. Incentivizing this effort are public calls to boycott the sale of ammunition and ammunition parts to Israel due to its war in Gaza. The new contract also follows a delay of ammunition shipments to Israel from the U.S. coinciding with Israel's entry into Rafah. The Iron Sting munition is a precisionguided 120mm mortar designed accurately target and destroy objectives, using both immune GPS and laser guidance technology.

US approves \$20 billion weapons sale to Israel amid regional tensions

The U.S. has approved \$20 billion in arms sales to Israel, including scores of fighter jets and advanced air-to-air missiles, the State Department announced on August 13. Congress was notified of the impending sale, which includes more than 50 F-15 fighter jets, Advanced Medium Air-to-Air Range Missiles. AMRAAMs, 120mm tank ammunition, high explosive mortars and tactical vehicles. The move comes at a time of intense concern that Israel may become involved in a wider Middle East war. However, the weapons are not expected to get to Israel anytime soon, with the contracts slated to take years to fulfill.

Much of what is being sold is to help Israel increase its military capability in the long term. The earliest systems being delivered under the contract aren't expected until the 2026 timeframe.

Jordan will not be a battlefield for Iran or Israel, foreign minister warns

Jordan's Foreign Minister Ayman Safadi said on August 10, that the kingdom would not be a battlefield for Iran or Israel, as the region braces for a possible new wave of attacks by Tehran and its allies following last week's killing of senior members of militant groups Hamas and Hezbollah.

"We will not be a battlefield for Iran or Israel. We informed the Iranians and the Israelis that we will not allow anyone to violate our airspace and risk the safety of our citizens," the Jordanian foreign minister said in an interview with Saudiowned Al Arabiya TV. "We will intercept anything that passes through our airspace or think that it constitutes a threat to us or our citizens."

60 rockets fired from Lebanon at northern Israel after assassination of top Hezbollah commander

At least 60 rockets were launched from southern Lebanon into northern Israel late August 1, in the first attack since Tel Aviv assassinated top Hezbollah commander Fuad Shukr earlier this week in Beirut. Israel's public broadcaster, KAN, reported that the rockets were launched towards the Western Galilee, with 15 of them being intercepted. An Israeli army statement said that five projectiles crossed from Lebanon Israel. some of which intercepted, and the rest fell in open areas. Hezbollah has not commented on the incident. The escalation comes against the backdrop of an Israeli onslaught on the Gaza Strip, which has killed nearly 39,500 people since last October following an attack by the Palestinian resistance group Hamas.

Tension with Lebanon 'may escalate into war,' Israel's defence minister says

Israeli Defense Minister Yoav Gallant warned on August 7, that the escalating tension along the border with Lebanon may deteriorate into a war. "As things

stand, (Hezbollah leader Hassan) Nasrallah may drag Lebanon into paying extremely heavy prices. They can't even imagine what might happen," Gallant said as he attended a drill simulating a conflict in Lebanon. "This may also deteriorate into a war. It's not theoretical, it's real," he added in statements cited by The Times of Israel newspaper. Regional tensions have escalated following last week's assassination of Hamas political chief Ismail Haniyeh in Tehran. While Hamas and Iran accused Israel of carrying out Haniyeh's assassination, Tel Aviv has not confirmed denied or responsibility. Hezbollah has also threatened to retaliate against Israel following the assassination of its senior commander Fouad Shukr in an airstrike in Beirut's southern suburb on July 30.

Israel kills Hamas commander in Lebanon's Sidon; bodyguard said critically wounded

An Israeli airstrike on August 9, killed a Hamas commander in the southern Lebanese port city of Sidon, in a joint operation claimed by the Israel Defence Forces and Shin Bet security service. A Hamas source and two other security sources told Reuters that Samer al-Hajj's bodyguard was also critically wounded in the strike. According to a statement from the military and Shin Bet, al-Hajj was responsible for "advancing terror attacks"

and projectile launches from Lebanon toward Israeli territory." Al-Hajj was the commander of Hamas's military forces in the Ein el-Hilweh Palestinian refugee camp near Sidon, and responsible for "recruiting and training terrorists to attack the State of Israel," the Israeli statement added. Lebanon's official National News Agency reported that al-Hajj was traveling in a SUV when it was struck by two missiles.

'Far from Victory' – Israeli officer's challenge claims of victory in Gaza in open letter

"We, who came from the field, know very well that the situation is still far from victory," the officers said. Dozens of Israeli reserve officers said in a letter on August 11, that the Israeli army remains "far from victory" in Gaza despite Tel Aviv's ongoing genocidal war on the Strip, Israeli media reported. The letter, signed by over 70 officers, was addressed to Israeli Chief of Staff Herzi Halevi. It reportedly expressed surprise at recent claims by senior army officials that victory is near and that it may be time to transition to pinpoint raids. "The public sees the bombings and targeted assassinations and thinks this is how a war should be fought," the officers said adding: "It is important to us that the public knows that this is not how wars are won, wars are won on foot. You conquer territory, cleanse it, hold it, and move on to the next target." "We, who came from the field, know very well that the situation is still far from victory," the officers added, pointing out that Palestinian Resistance groups continue to have cross-border capabilities, including UAVs, explosive drones, and mortars.

'US funding of Israeli genocide ballooning' – UN rapporteur, Francesca Albanese

A prototype space balloon designed for tourist flights to the stratosphere is set to undergo testing in Saudi Arabia this September, marking a significant step toward commercial space tourism. Halo Space, a Spanish startup, has developed the balloon with the goal of offering zeroemission trips to altitudes of up to 35 kilometers, it announced in a statement. The company plans to begin commercial operations in 2026, with each ticket expected to cost around 150,000 euros (\$163,791). Before launching commercial flights, Halo Space must demonstrate the balloon's safety. The upcoming test in Saudi Arabia, supported by the country's Communications, Space and Technology Commission (CST), aims to validate critical systems. "This mission is designed to meticulously validate all our critical systems we've been developing for the past three years," Alberto Castrillo, Halo Space's Chief Technology Officer, said in a statement. The test flight will see the prototype capsule, named Aurora, ascend to 30 kilometers above Earth's surface. Throughout the flight, the company will assess the technology's performance.

Berlin Group 21: OPCW hid evidence and facts about alleged use of chemical weapons in Syria

The report suggested restoring the OPCW's credibility by ensuring its full compliance with the Chemical Weapons Convention, and called on senior management to address concerns raised by former OPCW experts Brendan Whelan and Ian Henderson.

Turkish defence giants shake up rankings among world's top 100

Five Turkish defence companies found their place among the top 100 firms on the list published by world-renowned Defence News on August 6. The list published annually saw the addition of the arms maker Mechanical and Chemistry Industry Corp. (MKE) among leading defense firms. Last year four Turkish companies made it to the top 100.
