# Iran supports Armenia's territorial integrity and 'Crossroads of Peace' project - Vice President

Armenian Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan received on October 1, an Iranian government delegation led by the First Vice President of the Islamic Republic Mohammad Reza Arif, the Armenian government reported. Reaffirming the words of the Supreme Leader of the Islamic Revolution Seyyed Ali Khamenei, the First Vice President of the Islamic Republic once again stressed that Iran fully supports Armenia's territorial integrity and considers inadmissible any changes of borders in the region. At the same time, he stressed Iran's determination and readiness for diverse cooperation with Armenia. Pashinyan noted that the continuous development of Armenia's relations with Iran is one of the priorities of his government. The Prime Minister highly assessed Iran's principled and public position on the territorial integrity of the Republic of Armenia and inviolability of its internationally recognised state borders.

## Armenia eyes South Korea's K2 main battle tank adapted for mountainous terrain

According to an article by the South Korean media outlet Chosun Biz, dated October 4, 2024, Armenian Defence Minister Suren Papikyan visited South Korea in September 2024 to explore the possibility of acquiring K2 Black Panther main battle tanks developed by Hyundai Rotem. This visit also allowed the Armenian minister to attend the 2024 High-Level Meeting on Responsible Military Use of Artificial Intelligence (REAIM), organized by South Korea's Ministry of National Defence and Ministry of Foreign Affairs on September 9

and 10. According to the Armenian Military Portal, Papikyan also used this visit to initiate discussions on the supply of South Korean weapons, with a particular interest in the K2 tank. The K2 main battle tank, currently used by the South Korean Army, features a semi-active pneumatic suspension system, advanced an technology that is especially well-suited to mountainous terrains. In Armenia, where nearly 86% of the territory is mountainous, this capability could provide a significant strategic advantage by enhancing the mobility and precision of troops in combat. Additionally, the tank is equipped with a sensor that automatically adjusts the suspension based on the terrain, further improving accuracy and crew comfort.

### Azerbaijan increases gas exports to Europe in 2024

Azerbaijan exported 9.4 billion cubic meters of natural gas to Europe from January to September this year, as stated by Energy Minister Parviz Shahbazov on his "X" social media account, Azernews reports. During the same period, 7.3 billion cubic meters of gas were sent to Turkiye, and 1.7 billion cubic meters to Georgia. Notably, 4.2 billion cubic meters of gas were transported to Turkey through the Trans-Anatolian Gas Pipeline (TANAP). Gas exports from Azerbaijan saw an overall 4.2% increase compared to the same period last year. It is worth recalling that Azerbaijani gas began flowing to Europe via the Trans-Adriatic Pipeline (TAP) at the end of 2020, a key part of the Southern Gas Corridor. TAP's current capacity is 12 billion cubic meters per year, with plans to expand it to 20 billion cubic meters by 2027.

### Iran hits Israel's Netzarim military facility and Tel Nof intelligence unit

In its retaliatory military strikes on Israel late on October 1, night the Iranian military targeted the Netzarim military facility and the Tel Nof intelligence unit. The military attack was in response to the Israeli assassination of Hamas political chief Ismail Haniyeh in Tehran on July 31 and the killing of Iranian military advisor to Abbas Lebanon Brigadier General Nilforoushan, and Hezbollah leader Sayyed Hassan Nasrallah in the massive airstrike on Beirut on September 27. The Islamic Revolution Guard Corps used hypersonic Fatah missiles in targeting these two sites as well as the Nevatim air base. The Nevatim air base housed F-35 military jets. The fighter jets that bombarded Beirut on

September 27 flew from this military air base.

#### Iran launches dozens of missiles at Israel

On October 1, Iran announced it had launched dozens of missiles into Israel, marking a significant escalation in the ongoing conflict with Iran-backed militias Hezbollah and Hamas. There were no immediate reports of casualties, but Israel urged residents to seek shelter as air raid sirens rang out across the country, News.Az reports citing The Times Colonist. A series of window-shaking explosions were heard in Tel Aviv and near Jerusalem, though it was not immediately clear whether the sounds were from missiles landing or being intercepted by Israeli defenses, or both. Israel and the United States have warned there would be severe consequences in the event of an attack on Israel from Iran, which backs the militant group Hezbollah in Lebanon. President Joe Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris monitored the attack on Israel from the White House Situation Room.

### Satellite images show significant damage to Nevatim airbase

Satellite images reveal significant damage to Israel's Nevatim airbase that houses U.S.-made F-35 fighter jets after Iran launched a barrage of ballistic missiles at

Israeli military sites in retaliation to Israel's high-profile assassinations in Tehran and Beirut. Satellite images of the airbase show a large hole in the roof of an aircraft hangar. On October 1 evening, the Iranian military fired around 200 ballistic missiles at Israeli military and intelligence bases in response to the July 31 assassinations of Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh in Tehran, and the September 27 killing of Hezbollah leader Sayyed Hassan Nasrallah and Iranian military advisor to Lebanon Brigadier General Abbas Nilforoushan in Beirut. The airbase, located in the Negev desert, houses the Israeli Air Force's most advanced aircraft, including F-35 Lightning II stealth fighters. It also accommodates C-130 transport aircraft, Boeing 707 tankers, and reconnaissance planes. At least seven videos showed 20 to 30 Iranian ballistic missiles hitting base. the causing substantial damage, Tasnim reported. Some sources said over 20 fighter jets were destroyed.

#### Tehran not seeks tension, but is ready for war too

The Islamic Republic of Iran does not want to increase tension and conflict, Iranian foreign minister says. "The Islamic Republic of Iran does not want to increase tension and conflict, although it is ready for any incident. We are prepared for both war and peace," Iranian foreign minister, Abbas Araghchi said in a joint press conference with his Iraq counterpart Fuad Hussein n Baghdad on October 13. "The region is in a state of alarm, and the likelihood of an outbreak of clashes is very high, which is rooted in the Zionist regime's crimes," he noted, warning of the spread of the crisis to the other countries of the region. It is necessary to deal with the Israeli regime's acts of aggression in order to stop the war imposed on the people of Gaza and Lebanon, Araqchi stated. "We had good consultations with the Iraqi side, and I thank the Iraqi authorities for their positions," Araghchi said. The Zionist regime has minimized the possibility of providing aid to Lebanese refugees and does not allow it, he noted, adding, "We continue to send our aid to the Lebanese refugees. We also thank the Iraqi government for hosting a number of displaced and wounded Lebanese."

### Iran's president enacts preferential trade agreement with Indonesia

Iran's President Masoud Pezeshkian has signed into law the Preferential Trade Agreement (PTA) between Iran and Indonesia after it was approved by the Iranian parliament. The president enacted the deal on October 13 and issued a directive to ministries of industry and foreign affairs to implement it. The agreement was approved by Iran's Parliament on September 24 and ratified by the Guardian Council on October 2. Iranian Parliament Speaker Mohammad Bager Qalibaf, on October 8, formally informed President Pezeshkian of the approval of the PTA law between the governments of Iran and Indonesia, after it was approved by lawmakers. The agreement, initially signed in Tehran on June 20, 2005, aims to bolster trade ties between the two countries by reducing tariffs and removing non-tariff barriers.

#### Iran's nuclear program operates entirely within NPT framework – MP

Iran's nuclear activities are exclusively peaceful and are carried out within the framework of the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT), Iranian MP Mahmoud Nabavian said at the Standing Committee on Peace and Security of the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) in Geneva on October 14, Trend reports. According to him, Iran is a member of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty cooperates with the International Atomic Energy Agency within the framework of the agreement. Nabavian added that in this context, 92 percent of the International Atomic Energy Agency's inspections have been carried out in Iran. "Comparing the peaceful nuclear activities of Iran, a member of the nuclear non-proliferation agreement, with the nuclear activities of North Korea, which lies outside the agreement, is a wrong and unfair comparison," he said. The Iranian MP stated that the NPT has officially recognized the right of everyone to use nuclear energy for peaceful purposes and nothing can undermine this right. Iran's peaceful nuclear program poses no threat to human health or the environment.

### Iran plans to become a member of BRICS Development Bank

"We have a payment system between countries based on local currencies, which was one of the topics of this meeting. China, Russia and Iran are very interested in this issue," he noted.

#### Iran kicking around idea of setting up Atomic Energy Council

#### Israel's missiles on Iran in Iraqi airspace, Tehran threatens

Iraq and Jordan are the only two countries whose airspace Israel could potentially utilize for a strike on Iran, in response to Iran's missile attack in early October, Reuters reported. Gulf countries are pressuring Washington to prevent Israel from striking Iranian oil fields, fearing that such actions could lead to retaliatory attacks on their own oil facilities by groups aligned with Tehran if the conflict escalates, Reuters quoted Gulf sources as "Gulf states including Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates and Oatar are also refusing to let Israel fly over their airspace for any attack on Iran and have conveyed this to Washington," the same sources added. The three Gulf sources emphasized that Israel could route strikes through Jordan or Iraq, but using Saudi, UAE, or Qatari airspace was off the table and strategically unnecessary. Analysts also pointed out that Israel has other options, including mid-air refueling capabilities that would enable its jets to fly down the Red Sea into the Indian Ocean. proceed to the Gulf and then fly back, according to Reuters.

### Iraq warns against regional escalation, rejects use of airspace for strikes on Iran

On October 13, Iraqi Foreign Minister Fuad Hussein warned that the ongoing conflict involving Israel could expand to include Iran, potentially threatening global energy supplies and creating a worldwide crisis. During a joint press conference with his Iranian counterpart, Abbas Araghchi, who is visiting Baghdad, Hussein cautioned the widening against hostilities. "The Israeli aggression on Lebanon could lead to the outbreak of another war," he said. Hussein expressed concern that the continued fighting in Gaza and Lebanon poses a major threat to

regional security and stability. "The ongoing war is dangerous, and its escalation threatens the entire region," he said. "Iraq stance is firm, we are against using our airspace as part of any military action," stating, "The Iraqi government has not made any decision to engage in war. Such decisions rest with the state and its three authorities."

### Iraqi airstrikes kill four ISIS members, including a "key" leader

On October 15, the Joint Operations Command (JOC) reported that Iraqi Air Force F-16 jets carried out airstrikes that resulted in the deaths of ISIS members in Kirkuk governorate. The JOC stated, "On October 14, the F-16s executed two successful airstrikes targeting a terrorist hideout in the Laylan area at 11:30 PM." On October 15, at 5:00 AM, a force from the Iraqi Counter-Terrorism Service assessed the results of the strike and found four bodies of ISIS members, one of whom was a "key" leader. "All information will be verified after investigations are conducted," the JOC said. "The operation also resulted in the destruction of weapons, communication devices, and logistical materials, and the search operation is ongoing." Earlier today, a security source affirmed that a military operation by the Iraqi Counter-Terrorism Service was launched with air support in Kirkuk.

#### Benjamin Netanyahu vows retaliation after Iran fires barrage of missiles at Israel

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu vowed to retaliate against Iran after the Islamic republic fired scores of ballistic missiles at Israel on October 1, as the region slid ever closer towards all-out war. Speaking after the Israeli military said Tehran had fired about 180 missiles at the country. Netanyahu warned "Iran made a big mistake tonight — and it will pay for it". "Whoever attacks us, we will attack them," he said. Israeli military spokesperson Daniel Hagari said most of the Iranian missiles had been intercepted, but added there were "a few hits in the centre and other areas in the south of the country". He said the military was not aware of any casualties. The Guards warned that any Israeli response would result in "devastating" attacks on the Jewish state, adding that 90 per cent of its missiles had hit their targets.

# IDF strikes Hezbollah weapon production sites in multiple Beirut strikes

The IDF conducted targeted strikes in the area of Beirut against a number of Hezbollah weapon production facilities and terror infrastructure sites over the past few

days, Israel's military announced October 2 morning. According to the IDF, the strikes were conducted to degrade Hezbollah's military capabilities. It also noted that the Hezbollah terror group deliberately embedded its weapon production facilities beneath residential buildings within central Beirut, hiding them in populated areas. The IDF emphasized that numerous steps were taken to mitigate the risk of harming civilians and that it had sent out warnings in advance about the strikes to civilians in the Furthermore, during the early hours of October 2 morning, The IDF said that it was operating in Beirut, striking terror targets in the area. ### Can Israel destroy Iran's nuclear facilities by itself?

Asked if he would support an Israeli strike on Iran's nuclear facilities, US President Joe Biden on October 2, was unequivocal: "The answer is no." But without US support, a solo Israeli air strike on Iran's nuclear facilities would be highly risky and at best only delay rather than destroy its programme, according to analysts. Why would an Israeli operation be difficult? The first reason is distance. It is more than a thousand miles from Israel to Iran's main nuclear bases, and to reach them Israeli planes would have to cross the sovereign airspace of Saudi Arabia, Jordan, Iraq, Syria and potentially Turkey. The next is fuel. Flying to the targets and back would take all of Israel's aerial refuelling capability and leave little or no margin for error, according to a report by the US Congressional Research Service.

#### Israel cancels defence minister's visit to US

### Israel faces potential shortage of interceptor missiles — report

#### US to deploy THAAD missile defence system in Israel, to be operational against ballistic and hypersonic missiles

#### How long will Israel's war in Lebanon last?

#### The unravelling of the Gaza ceasefire talks

It was late July when three secretive men charged with a near-impossible mission believed they were finally on the cusp of a breakthrough. The US spy chief, the head of Egyptian intelligence and Qatar's prime minister arrived on a summer day at a private Oatari-owned villa in Rome, convinced that a ceasefire between Israel and Hamas was tantalisingly close. In the wake of Hamas's October 7 attack and Israel's subsequent offensive in Gaza, the negotiators had relentlessly nudged, cajoled and pressured both parties to accept an agreement that would secure the release of Israeli hostages and a permanent end to war in the besieged Palestinian enclave. The trio had known each other for years. Qatar's soft-spoken Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman al-Thani has helped establish the gas-rich Qatar state as a go-to mediator in various crises, and none mattered to him more than ending a war in his own backyard.

# Qatar demands international probe for Israeli targeting of UN peacekeepers in Lebanon

The resolution demands a complete cessation of hostilities between Lebanon and Israel and the establishment of a demilitarized zone between the Blue Line -- the boundary between Lebanon and Israel -- and the Litani River, allowing only the Lebanese army and UNIFIL to possess weapons and military equipment in the area.

### US approves \$1.2bn sale of GMLRS and ATACMS to UAE

The US State Department has approved a potential Foreign Military Sale to United Arab Emirates (UAE), involving Guided Multiple Launch Rocket System (GMLRS) and Army Tactical Missile Systems (ATACMS) munitions, along with related logistics and programme support. The deal is valued at an estimated \$1.2bn (Dh4.4bn). It will help the UAE modernise its military capabilities and enhance interoperability with the US and other partners. The Defence Security Cooperation Agency has formally notified Congress of the possible sale, which includes 259 GMLRS M31A1 unitary pods and 203 ATACMS M57 unitary missiles. ATACMS is a surface-tosurface artillery system designed to engage targets at distances greater. The system can be launched from the HIMARS and MLRS M270 platforms. Guided MLRS Unitary round offers precision strike for point targets. It integrates a 200lb unitary warhead and has a range of more than 70km.

### US strikes Houthi targets in Yemen as fears grow of wider Mideast war

The US military conducted multiple strikes on Houthi targets in Yemen on October 4,

resuming offensive action there as fears grow of a wider war in the Middle East. US Central Command said it carried out strikes on 15 Houthi targets at a number of locations around the country. "These actions were taken to protect freedom of navigation and make international waters safer and more secure for US, coalition and merchant vessels," Centcom said in a statement. The strikes against the Houthis, who have controlled Yemen's populous north since seizing the capital Sana'a and ousting the government in 2015, came as Iran and the wider region braced for Israel's response to this week's Iranian missile barrage against the country.

#### Israeli 'aggression' on Hasiya city in Syria's Homs, Syrian state TV says

Syrian state media reported an Israeli attack in central Homs province early October 10, after an Israeli strike hit the country's south the previous day. "An Israeli attack" targeted an industrial area in the town of Hassia, around 30 kilometres (20 miles) south of the city of Homs, state news agency SANA said, adding that "initial information" indicated the attack targeted a "car factory", reporting material damage. Citing the manager of the industrial area, SANA reported the "air attack" targeted not only a factory but also vehicles "loaded with medical and relief supplies... which led to a large fire" that firefighters were working to extinguish. Since Syria's civil war erupted in 2011, Israel has carried out hundreds of strikes in the country, mainly

targeting army positions and Iran-backed fighters, including Lebanon's Hezbollah.

Yemen's Houthis claim attacks on 2 vessels in Red Sea, Indian Ocean

The Yemeni Houthi group said October 10, it targeted two ships in the Red Sea and the Indian Ocean. One was an American ship and the other was owned by a company that allegedly violated the group's ban on entering Israeli ports. "The Yemeni Armed Forces (Houthis) carried out two military operations. The first targeted the American oil vessel OLYMPIC SPIRIT," group spokesperson Yahya Saree said in a recorded statement. "The American vessel was attacked in the Red Sea with 11 ballistic missiles and two drones, sustaining severe and direct damage." Saree noted that the second operation involved a cruise missile striking the St. John vessel with "a direct hit" in the Indian Ocean. He indicated that the St. John was targeted because the owning company had violated the ban on entering ports of occupied Palestine without specifying the nationality of the ship.
