Armenia's PM says he must return disputed areas to Azerbaijan or face war

Armenia could face a war with Azerbaijan if it does not compromise with Baku and return four Azerbaijani villages it has held since the early 1990s, Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan said in a video published on March 19, 2024. The four villages, which have been uninhabited for over 30 years,

are of strategic value to Armenia as they straddle the main road between Yerevan and the Georgian border. Russia's TASS state news agency quoted Pashinyan as telling residents in the video clip that was circulated by his government that failure to compromise over the disputed villages could lead to war with Azerbaijan "by the end of the week". Yerevan suffered a major defeat in September, 2023 when Baku's forces retook Nagorno-Karabakh in a lightning offensive, prompting almost all of that region's estimated 100,000 ethnic Armenians to flee to Armenia.

Armenia opposition MP: Enduring peace unattainable when Karabakh people are forcefully uprooted from their homeland

It had been six months since the armed of forces Azerbaijan attacked and conquered the territory of Nagorno-Karabakh. Armenian opposition MP Levon Kocharyan stated this in his speech during 148th Assembly of the Interthe Parliamentary Union in Geneva, Switzerland, Levon Kocharvan, who is also the son of Armenia's second President Robert Kocharyan, added as follows: "Indeed, on September 19, 2023, after enduring nearly 10 months of a blockade that caused mass starvation, deprivation, illness, and death, and now faced with imminent destruction, over 120,000 Armenians, virtually the entire population, were forced to leave their homeland in just a few days. The people of Nagorno-Karabakh have an ancient and profound connection to their homeland. historical evidence dating back centuries. Generations have lived, worked, and built their lives in this region, establishing a rich cultural heritage that binds them to the land. Under Articles of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, the Armenians of Nagorno-Karabakh have the absolute right to return to their homeland. On March 12 the European Parliament adopted a resolution calling on Azerbaijan to 'genuinely engage in a comprehensive and transparent dialogue with the Karabakh Armenians to ensure respect for their rights and guarantee their security, including their right to return to and live in their homes in dignity and safety under international presence.'

Urgent action needed to address Azerbaijan's violation of Armenian POWs' rights under Geneva convention

The Committee for the Protection of the Fundamental Rights of the Artsakh (Nagorno-Karabakh) People is gravely alarmed by recent reports detailing Azerbaijan's flagrant violations of the rights of Armenian prisoners of war (POWs), particularly in regard to the fundamental principle of the right to be free from public curiosity as outlined in the Third Geneva Convention Relative to the Treatment of Prisoners of War. These actions are not only morally reprehensible,

but also in direct contravention international humanitarian law. In light of these egregious violations, we urgently call upon state actors and human rights organisations to take direct action to prevent Azerbaijan from further airing videos or interviews of POWs and hostages. This includes leveraging diplomatic channels, imposing sanctions if necessary, and issuing public condemnations Azerbaijan to hold accountable for its actions. Therefore, it is imperative that all states parties take immediate and decisive action to prevent any and all retransmission of such Azerbaijani broadcasts of such videos on any and all servers, media and/or platforms under their jurisdictions.

Kirill Komarov: Rosatom can offer Armenia nuclear reactors with capacity of 50 to 1,000 MW

Rosatom State Atomic Energy Corporation of Russia can offer Armenia nuclear reactors of various capacities, from 50 to 1,000 MW. This was stated by the Rosatom First **CEO** Corporate Deputy for Development and International Business, Kirill Komarov, at a press conference within the framework of the ATOMEXPO-2024 International Forum in Sochi, Russia. According to Komarov, the Armenian authorities will have to decide which nuclear reactor to choose. "There are various predictions about how much power the unit needs. I communicate with our energy partners, and there are various opinions that Armenia is interested in a thousand-ton unit, especially if it is possible some partial export provide neighbouring countries, for example, Georgia. Therefore, this is still a matter that should be resolved by the leadership of Armenia," said Komarov. He emphasised that Rosatom's product line enables the implementation of any decision by the Armenian government.

Bahrain condemns Israeli authorities' confiscation of Palestinian lands in West Bank

The Kingdom of Bahrain has strongly condemned the Israeli authorities' announcement to confiscate 800 hectares of land in the occupied Palestinian territory in the Jordan Valley in the West Bank, stressing that it is a blatant violation of the principles of international law, as well as a threat to the peace process, and the rights of the Palestinian people to establish their independent state on the borders of June 4, 1967 with East Jerusalem as its capital, in accordance with the two-state solution, the Arab Peace Initiative, and international legitimacy resolutions. The Ministry called international community implement resolutions related to stopping "illegitimate" settlement policies, and preventing extremist settler attacks on Palestinians in the West Bank, including East Jerusalem. In its statement, the Foreign Affairs Ministry also called for creating serious conditions to resume the just and comprehensive peace process, in a way that would achieve security, stability, and peace for all the peoples of the region.

Nuclear technology has promoted Iran's political status in the world: Kamalyandi

Behrouz Kamalvandi, the spokesman for the Atomic Energy Organization of Iran (AEOI), said it was because of the paramount importance of the nuclear industry that "we are now witnessing multiple problems that have been created" by the West for Iran, IRNA reported. Citing an example of nuclear technology in the health sector, the official said now over a million patients in Iran are receiving radiopharmaceuticals. Kamalvandi, who is also in charge of the AEOI department for international and legal affairs, went on to say that Iran would have now faced difficulty importing nuclear medicine if it had not mastered nuclear technology. The nuclear official said Iran is now exporting radiopharmaceuticals to other countries as well. Due to sanctions Iran was never allowed to import nuclear materials for radiopharmaceuticals, producing pointed out. Quoting Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, he said, "As mentioned by the Supreme Leader of the Revolution, this industry is a source of honour for the country and contributes to its power. Besides its effects on people's lives, this industry also brings power and honour to the country politically."

Iran, EU push for talks to lift nuclear sanctions

In a telephone conversation on March 25, 2024, Iranian Foreign Minister Hossein Amir Abdollahian and European Union Foreign Policy Chief Josep Borrell highlighted the significance of sustainable talks and exchange of visits to lift nuclear-

related sanctions on Iran. Amir Abdollahian pointed to the recent talks between his political deputy Ali Bagheri Kani and Borrell's deputy Enrique Mora about the resumption of nuclear talks and said, "The Islamic Republic of Iran is firm in its decision for sustainable and constructive talks with the International Atomic Energy Agency, and in return really expects the Western sides honour their obligations in the nuclear talks and show full commitment to remove sanctions." The 2015 nuclear Joint deal. officially called the Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA), was ditched by Donald Trump in May 2018. Abdollahian praised Borrell's position on the need to stop the Israeli war on Gaza and send humanitarian aid to the 2.3 million people in the coastal enclave who have been started by the Israeli regime.

Israel's hopes to disintegrate Iran will not be realised: spox

Nasser Kanaani, spokesperson for the Iranian Foreign Ministry, conveyed this criticism via a post on the X social media platform, formerly known as Twitter, on March 16, 2024, in direct response to comments made by Mordechai Kedar. Kedar, who currently serves as a lecturer at Bar-Ilan University and holds the position of vice president at NEWSRAEL newsfeed, suggested instigating ethnic tensions in Iran as a means to prompt a regime change. The spokesman wrote, "This is not the first time such sentiments have been expressed by Iran's adversaries. Kedar's remarks echo

previous assertions made by elements within the Zionist establishment, including acknowledgments of Zionist military involvement in neighbouring countries." The 2022 riots in Iran, as an example, became a shining stage for behind-thescenes orchestrators who aimed to foment sedition in Iran with the ultimate goal of breaking up the country. Individuals working for foreign organisations and media outlets have been accused of propagating narratives that advocate for Iran's breakup, thereby exacerbating internal tensions and fueling separatist sentiments. The role of foreign-based media outlets in amplifying voices calling for Iran's disintegration has come under scrutiny, with concerns raised about the influence of external actors in shaping perceptions of Iran both domestically and internationally.

Tehran, Baku underscore need to 'open new chapter' in bilateral ties

Abbas Mousavi, Iran's ambassador to Azerbaijan, noted that after attempts by both sides to clear up misconceptions. Tehran and Baku have underlined the need to "open a new chapter" in ties between the two neighbours. After meeting with the Azerbaijani President's aide, Hikmet Hajiyev, in Tehran on March 16, 2024, Mousavi stressed, "We have actively pursued a course of reconciliation and renewal in bilateral relations, leveraging wisdom, insight, and foresight. disruptive influence of shared adversaries, alongside select regional actors and regimes, particularly through their security apparatus, is palpable in exacerbating tensions between Iran and the Republic of Azerbaijan." After an attack on the nation's embassy in Tehran in January of 2023, which Baku called a "terrorist act," the country's relations with Iran were tense. "We are in contact with the officials of Armenia and Azerbaijan. Iran is sensitive about the security of its northern borders and is closely watching the situation, he pointed out.

Iran will never pay ransom to killer of General Soleimani: Report

Tehran Times, March 17, 2024

Stimson Center in a report by Barbara Slavin, an expert on Iran, writes that the nuclear agreement with Iran fell apart after Trump's administration withdrew from the JCPOA in 2018, while Tehran fully adhered to it. It was claimed that in September 2023, Tehran and the United States were able to reach an informal agreement to reduce tensions by reducing Iran's 60% uranium enrichment speed and Iranian-American release two citizens. One idea is to allow Iran to keep a large amount of 60% enriched uranium under the supervision of the International Atomic Energy Agency on Iranian soil, but this cannot be initiated unless Iran significantly increases transparency about its program and restores some of the JCPOA monitoring measures. Another idea is to use the revival of diplomatic relations between Iran and Saudi Arabia to create a regional consensus where, in exchange for some nuclear concessions, Iran is compensated by Arab investments. The report concludes by stating that Iran,

like other parts of the world, is trying to prepare itself for the possibility of a second Trump administration.

Iran, Syria defence ministers condemn U.S., Israel's attacks on Damascus

During a meeting with Syrian counterpart Ali Mahmoud Abbas on March 16, 2024, Iranian Defense Minister Brigadier General Mohammad Reza Ashtiani cautioned against schemes by the U.S. and Israel to escalate tensions throughout West Asia. He affirmed Iran's readiness to leverage its complete capacities to aid Syria in bolstering its defence and deterrence capabilities against the U.S. and Israel. Stressing the importance of creating deterrence as the primary strategic against these attacks, approach announced that necessary and urgent measures, along with strategic planning, are already underway to prevent further aggression from this regime. Highlighting the dire circumstances in the region, the Minister of Defense emphasised the tragic toll of over 30,000 fatalities and 70,000 injuries. Tel Aviv has significantly increased its airstrikes against Syria since October 2023, coinciding with the start of its aggressive military campaign against the Gaza Strip. Damascus has lodged multiple complaints with the United Nations regarding the Israeli attacks, urging the Security Council to intervene against Tel Aviv's unlawful actions.

However, these appeals have been ignored.

KDP urges resolution of crisis between Baghdad and Erbil

The Kurdistan Democratic Party (KDP) bloc in the Iraqi Parliament called for an end to the "manufactured crisis" between Baghdad and Erbil, cautioning against leading Iraq into "an unknown and complicated situation." In a statement on the Newroz occasion, the bloc criticised the recent decisions of the Federal Court. deeming them "contrary to the spirit of the constitution." The court, in February 2023, had declared that a specific article concerning the minority quota in KRG's provincial election law was deemed "unconstitutional." The SAC coalition was established following Muqtada Al-Sadr's withdrawal from politics. It comprises mainly the KDP, led by Masoud Barzani, the Sunni Sovereignty, led by Khamis al-Khanjar, and the Iran-backed Shiite coalition forces (Coordination Framework). The UN Assistance Mission for Iraq (UNAMI) called on the Kurdish parties to prioritise the people's interests and consider parliamentary holding the elections "essential."

Rasool: Military, technical committees sent to numerous countries to buy antiaircraft weaponry

Major General Yehia Rasool, the Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces'

spokesman, announced on Monday that military and technical committees have been sent to numerous countries negotiate contracts for the purchase of antiaircraft weapons, confirming the ongoing operation of the radar system in general. "Iraq contracted for French radars and a shipment arrived from them, and we are going to complete the radar system in general," Major General Rasool said to the Iraqi News Agency (INA), adding that "there are low, medium, and high-range radars." Hussein Hashim al-Amiri, a member of the parliamentary security and defence committee, noted that "the first phase of the GM403 radar contract with the French company Thales, by 4 radars, has been installed tactically." He clarified, saying, "An air defence missile system with a range of 100 km and an amount of 4 billion and a half billion euros was offered, provided that it is later developed for a greater distance, provided that Iraq pays one billion and 200 million euros." The statement added that "the extensive intelligence operations conducted by the National Security Service resulted in his capture and subsequent handover to the judicial authorities."

Biden administration said to approve transfer of over 2,000 bombs, 25 F-35s to Israel

Times of Israel, March 29, 2024

The United States, in March 2024, authorised the transfer of billions of dollars worth of bombs and fighter jets to Israel even as it publicly expresses concerns about an anticipated military offensive in Rafah, The Washington Post reported. Citing Pentagon and State Department officials, the American daily said the new arms package included 1,800 MK-84 2,000pound bombs and 500 MK-82 500-pound bombs, along with 25 F-35s that were initially approved as part of a larger package by Congress in 2008. Israel requested the third squadron of 25 F-35s last July, which when delivered brought the total size of the fleet to 75. Washington gives \$3.8 billion in annual military assistance to Israel, its longtime ally. The US has been rushing air defences and munitions to Israel as it fights against Hamas in Gaza, but some Democrats and Arab American groups have criticised the Biden administration's steadfast support of Israel, and called for leveraging military aid. "We have continued to support Israel's right to defend itself," a White House The Washington official told "Conditioning aid has not been our policy."

IDF Raids Shifa Hospital in Gaza, Calls on Area Residents to Evacuate

Foundation for Defence of Democracies, March 18, 2024

According to a press briefing by IDF Spokesman Rear Adm. Daniel Hagari, the operation was based on intelligence showing that Shifa was being used by senior Hamas operatives "to command attacks against Israel." IDF Arabiclanguage spokesman Avichay Adraee issued a call to people in the Rimal neighbourhood of Gaza City and in the hospital and its environs to evacuate the area immediately and head to the Al-Mawasi humanitarian zone located on the coast of southern Gaza. In Hagari's press briefing, he stated that the IDF would provide "food, water, and other supplies" to Shifa patients and that its forces include doctors "to assist those in need" and Arabic speakers to enable communication with patients. On March 17, 2024, IDF Chief of Staff Lt. Gen. Herzi Halevi gave an update on the first 163 days of the war, stating that the IDF still has "a long way to go until the goals of the war are achieved." He noted that in northern Gaza, the army is returning to areas in which it operated previously, different methods intelligence, killing Hamas operatives, and destroying infrastructure. In Khan Younis in southern Gaza, the army is focusing its efforts on dismantling Hamas's Khan Younis Brigade and has captured a large number of high-ranking terror operatives for interrogation, killing many as well.

At least 32,782 Palestinians have been killed and 75,298 wounded in Israeli attacks on Gaza since October 7. The revised death toll in Israel from Hamas's October 7 attack stands at 1,139, with dozens still held captive.

Gaza to receive desperately needed food aid in the coming days by ship as death toll rises

Nearly 400 tons of food aid arrived in Gaza by ship towards the end of March, according to a nongovernmental organisation arranging the deliveries. In March, Israeli authorities denied 30% of humanitarian aid missions to northern Gaza and 10% of missions into southern Gaza, the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA). About 9,000 patients stuck in Gaza require urgent evacuation abroad, World Health Organization Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus said. The Israel Defense Forces said on March 30, 2024 that operations are ongoing around the Gaza City medical complex, where it says its forces "continued to eliminate terrorists." Negotiations over a ceasefire and hostage deal between Israel and Hamas are expected to resume in Cairo on Sunday, Egypt's state-run Al-Qahera News reported on March 30, 2024, citing a security source. Four peacekeepers affiliated with the UN's peacekeeping mission in Lebanon were injured. The IDF quickly denied reports in Lebanese media that it was behind the attack.

TV report: Israel prepared to free close to 800 Palestinian security prisoners for 40 hostages

Where February's Paris framework had provided for the release of 400 Palestinian security prisoners in exchange for 40 hostages — women, children, the sick and elderly — in the first phase of a deal, during a 6-week truce, Israel is now ready to free "almost double that number," Channel 12 reported, including 100 murderers. Israel has ruled

out a full return of Gazans to the north of the Strip as part of the deal, the report stressed. Crucially, it added, Israel continues to hold to "red lines" that rule out a complete IDF withdrawal from Gaza, and insists that the campaign to destroy Hamas will resume once the deal is carried out.

Saudi crown prince, Blinken discuss situation in Gaza

Saudi Arabia's Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman had received US Secretary of State Antony Blinken in Jeddah, as the US diplomat made his sixth tour of the region. The meeting discussed "Developments in the Gaza Strip, and efforts made to stop military operations and deal with their security and humanitarian repercussions," the SPA added. Blinken landed in Jeddah earlier on March 21, 2024, on the first leg of a regional tour that was extended to include Israel. Saudi Foreign Minister Prince Faisal bin Farhan and Blinken discussed the "importance of an immediate ceasefire" in Gaza. Another major area of concern for the US has been the fate of Rafah in the far south of the Gaza Strip. Biden has put pressure on Netanyahu to pull back from a full-scale ground offensive on the tiny area, where up to 1.5 million Palestinians are sheltering after being driven from their homes elsewhere. "President Biden has been very clear – that we cannot support a major ground operation, military operation in Rafah," Blinken said.

Israeli air strikes kill dozens in Syria

Syria claimed the Israeli air strike coincided with another attack by the terrorist groups who control a part of the country in the north. An unspecified number of civilians and military personnel were killed in the early morning on Friday, March 29 when Israel launched yet another air airstrike in Syria. The Syrian Arab News Agency (SANA) did not mention the number of casualties. Reuters, citing some unnamed sources, claimed that at least 38 people were killed in the attacks. According to Syria's official news agency, the Israeli air strike, which happened at around 1:45 AM local time, coincided with a drone attack carried out by "terrorist organisations from Idlib and western countryside of Aleppo province." Israel has repeatedly targeted Aleppo and other parts of Syria since the beginning of the Syrian war in 2011, killing hundreds of civilians and military personnel. Israel had bombed the airport even during the devastating earthquake last year, when it

was the hub of humanitarian supplies to the country, disrupting the relief work. Syria had raised the issue of unprovoked Israeli aggression repeatedly in the UN, calling it an aid to the armed terrorist groups against the government and an attempt to prolong the war in the country and demanding action against Israel as per the UN charter.

US and allies continue to wash their hands off role in prolonging Syrian war

The US and its European allies issued a joint statement on the occasion of the 13th anniversary of war in Syria. Syria's Foreign and Expatriate ministry, while rejecting the statement, condemned the West's narrative by calling it "intended propaganda" which is aimed to "divert the attention" from real causes of the problem Syrians are facing. The Syrian government claimed, "over the past 13 years the governments of the US, the United Kingdom, France and Germany have continued their hostile approach against Syria by using all the tools of war against it." The US and its regional and European allies were responsible for providing military and financial support to groups which tried to overthrow the Assad government in 2011 prompting the war. The direct military support provided by the US and its allies in the region, though discontinued after a few years, aided the extremist elements in the region and gave birth to ISIS in 2014 prolonging and intensifying the war.

Israel carries out several attacks inside Lebanon and Syria killing civilians

Early on Wednesday, March 27, its forces bombed an emergency response centre at al-Habbaniyah in southern Lebanon's Nabatieh region killing at least seven people. The attack followed another Israeli air strike in northern Lebanon's Bekaa region where at least four other Lebanese were killed. The strike on Bekaa was the second attack on northern Lebanon since October 8 when Israel began bombing the country. There were 12 people inside the response centre at al-Habbaniyah at the time of the attack. Israeli armed forces also carried out airstrikes in Svria's Deir Ezzor province on Tuesday, killing at least seven other people, including an Iranian military advisor to the Bashar al-Assad government. Both SANA and Al-Mayadeen said Israel carried out these attacks in collaboration with the US. Al-Mayadeen reported that the two countries carried out 10 attacks targeting both military and civilian infrastructure. Israel claimed the attacks were carried out to prevent alleged armed shipments to Hamas. The Syrian government condemned the attacks. It held the US responsible for the act saying that such attacks would keep the region unstable and "explosive."

Türkiye aims to reach 7.2 GW nuclear capacity by 2035: Official

Türkiye aims to reach 7.2 gigawatts (GW) of nuclear capacity by 2035 and 20

gigawatts by 2050 in its energy mix, a senior official said Monday, highlighting the "critical role" nuclear energy plays in reaching the country's net zero emission target. "We want to use renewable energy. But we must balance these intermittent resources such as solar and wind with the base load," Energy and Natural Resources Minister Alparslan Bayraktar said in his address at the two-day international nuclear energy event ATOMEXPO-2024 kicked off on March 25, 2024, in the Russian coastal city of Sochi. Nuclear energy plays a critical role in reaching the country's 2053 net zero emission target, and to this end, a further two nuclear plants are planned in addition to the Akkuyu Nuclear Power Plant (NPP), which is under construction in the Mersin province on the Mediterranean coast. Bayraktar explained that the country's nuclear energy program, which he described as a "huge undertaking" is in line with the declaration made at the last U.N. climate conference, COP28 when the international community agreed that the world needs to triple its nuclear capacity by 2050.

Erdoğan says Türkiye ready to facilitate Russia-Ukraine peace talks

According to the Communications Directorate, Erdoğan called Putin to congratulate him on late March 18, 2024. "Expressing his belief that the positive course in the Türkiye-Russia relations would increasingly continue in the new period, President Erdoğan stated that Türkiye stands ready to assume any

facilitating role in returning to the negotiating table in Ukraine," read the statement. Russia staged a war against Ukraine in February 2022 and occupied the eastern Ukrainian territories. Türkiye has been one of few countries calling for the cessation of armed conflict between the two neighbours since the beginning of the war. It hosted Russian and Ukrainian foreign ministers in March 2022 in Antalya for talks on a lasting agreement. Ankara blames some Western countries for discouraging Ukraine to sit at the same table with Russia. President Erdoğan has repeatedly called on both Putin and Ukraine President Volodomyr Zelensky to give a chance to peace talks and that Türkiye stands ready to play the role of a facilitator. Underlining that Türkiye doesn't expect much to change during the war in 2024 amid the West's plans to create a peace table in 2025, Fidan reminded that the continuation of the war will create more casualties and destruction.

Türkiye says it won't recognize Crimea annexation

The Foreign Ministry issued a written statement "Regarding the Tenth Anniversary of the Illegal Annexation of Crimea" on March 16, 2024. "It has been a decade since the Russian Federation annexed the Autonomous Republic of Crimea of Ukraine through an illegitimate referendum held on 16 March

2014," read the statement. "Türkiye reiterates that it does not recognize this de facto situation, which constitutes violation of international law. underlines its support for Ukraine's territorial integrity and sovereignty," it added. Türkiye is in efforts for the cessation of the war between Russia and Ukraine since February 2022. Russian forces entered the Crimean Peninsula in February 2014, and in March formally annexed the region – a move that Türkiye, the U.N., the U.S. and the EU, all view as illegal.

Headline inflation increased significantly to 20 percent in December, driven by the depreciation of the kwanza and cuts in fuel subsidies.

UAE, Kenya sign Investment Memorandum to advance digital infrastructure, AI initiatives

The "digital corridor" concept is integral to this Memorandum. representing an interconnected network infrastructure enabling secure data exchange, hosting, processing, and transmission between the UAE and Kenya.
