Armenia

Armenia deepens military ties with western allies

The European Union has announced a milestone decision that involves pumping millions of euros into Armenia's industries in an attempt to pull the country closer to Western allies and away from its historical ally, Russia. Following talks in Brussels with Armenian Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan, the European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen said that the bloc will invest €270 million (\$287 million) over the next four years to support the country's economy.

India is broadening its military footprint, to send defence attaches to more nations across Africa and Asia

India will deploy defence attaches in Mozambique, Ethiopia, **Ivorv** Philippines, Armenia, and Poland, marking a significant shift in its strategic approach to bolster ties with key regions amidst growing geopolitical tensions. As per a report in Hindustan Times, specifically, India will assign defence attaches to Poland and Armenia for the first time, reflecting the heightened importance of these nations as security partners. This move follows a major arms deal with Armenia and underscores Poland's increasing significance European security in

dynamics. The external affairs ministry plans to establish 26 new missions globally, with 18 in African nations, HT reported. India led efforts to include the African Union in the G20 during last year's summit in New Delhi. These new postings will underscore Africa's significance and foster opportunities for military cooperation and arms sales, particularly as many African countries aim to modernize their armed forces.

Iran sees Israel's presence in UAE as threat: IRGC commander

The commander of the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) Navy has criticized the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and other regional countries for allowing Israel to gain a foothold in the Persian Gulf region, warning that Iran sees the move as a threat to national and regional security. In an interview with Lebanon's al-Mayadeen television network, Rear Admiral Alireza Tangsiri expressed concern over the growing ties between the Israeli regime and certain countries in the region. The top commander emphasized allowing this transgression to take place in such a vital region as the Persian Gulf is not in keeping with the spirit of good neighbourliness and Muslim brotherhood and carries significant implications.

Nuclear deal in tatters, Iran edges close to weapons capability

Six years after the Trump administration withdrew from the Iran nuclear accord. Tehran is rapidly accumulating enriched uranium, some of it very close to weapons grade. Experts fear that a bomb could be a short dash away. For the past 15 years, the most important clues about Iran's nuclear program have laid deep underground, in a factory built inside a mountain on the edge of Iran's Great Salt Desert. The facility, known as Fordow, is the heavily protected inner sanctum of Iran's nuclear complex and a frequent destination for international inspectors whose visits are meant to ensure against any secret effort by Iran to make nuclear bombs. The inspectors' latest trek, in February, yielded the usual matrices of readings and measurements, couched in the clinical language of a U.N. nuclear watchdog report. But within the document's dry prose were indications of alarming change.

Israel getting punished with Operation 'True Promise'

Iran has launched retaliatory attacks against the occupied territories, after the Israeli regime struck the country's embassy in Damuscas on April 1, killing 7 highranking military officials. Israeli reports say Iran has already fired three waves of drones at Israeli positions, as well as a number of cruise missiles. Footage captured by citizens in Iraq, suggests Iran's famous Shahed-136 drones are among the UAVs launched at the occupied territories. The initial announcement regarding the launch of the Iranian attacks came from the Israeli military. Daniel Hagari, the army's spokesperson, stated that the drones would take some hours to reach their destination while emphasizing Israel's readiness for the situation. During a briefing with the press, Hagari highlighted that Israel has defensive and offensive measures in place and maintains close cooperation with the U.S. and regional partners.

Iron Dome fails to intercept Iranian ballistic missiles

The Israeli regime's defence systems, including the Iron Dome, have failed to intercept ballistic missiles fired from Iran toward the occupied territories, with released images showing the missiles raining down and hitting their designated targets. Based on the images, the missiles fired at the occupied territories were equipped with cluster warheads, a feature that led to the confusion of air defence systems to intercept the weapons. This is the first time that Iran has used missiles equipped with cluster warheads. Israel's Iron Dome also failed to intercept Iranian missiles in the al-Khalil region. Iran launched hundreds of missiles and drones at key military sites in the Israeli-occupied territories in retaliation for the regime's

airstrike on the Iranian consulate in Syria that left seven military advisors dead on April 1.

Flying missiles over Knesset 'big victory' for Iran: Zionist researcher

Iran has achieved a big victory by flying missiles and drones in the skies over key Israeli facilities including the Knesset. This is according to an Israeli researcher making comments on the Iranian military action against the regime over its recent strike on Iran's consulate in Syria. Iran launched hundreds of missiles and drones at the Israeli-occupied territories late on Saturday to punish the regime for its strike that killed seven Iranian military advisors including a senior Islamic Revolution Guards Corps commander in Damascus on April 1. Beni Sabti, a researcher at the Institute for National Security Studies think-tank, believes that the Saturday night attack marked a big victory for Iran as the country managed to penetrate Israeli airspace, with its missiles and drones flying over the city of Al-Quds and Al-Aqsa Mosque as well as the Israeli parliament (the Knesset) "We are not in conflict now. It seems that we are in an equal situation. But the reality is different. The victory and success of Iran is greater", he told Kan, the Israeli regime's public broadcasting corporation.

Israeli military to soon receive Oshkosh joint light tactical vehicles

Israel's Defence Ministry has confirmed that Joint Light Tactical Vehicles (JLTVs) produced by the U.S. company Oshkosh are en route to the country. In a statement released on March 28, the ministry announced that Major General (Ret.) Eyal Zamir, the Director General of the Ministry Defence. visited the Ministry's procurement delegation in New York. During the visit, a situation assessment was conducted regarding the ongoing procurement operation and the transportation logistics to Israel. Accompanied by Brigadier General (Ret.) Michel Ben Baruch, head of the delegation, Zamir toured the logistics center of the Ministry of Defence delegation, reviewing the equipment acquired by the ministry, notably the protected off-road vehicles, including the JLTV jeep manufactured by Oshkosh.

Biden considers \$18bn arms transfer to Israel, including F-15 jets: Report

US President Joe Biden's administration is weighing whether to go ahead with an \$18bn arms transfer package to Israel that would include dozens of F-15 aircraft, according to the Reuters news agency. The sale of 25 F-15s has been under review since the US received the formal request in

January 2023, Reuters reported, citing one of five sources familiar with the plans, long before Israel's six-month-old military campaign in Gaza. This sale would boost that number to as many as 50 F-15s. Accelerating delivery of the aircraft was among the top requests from Israeli Minister of Defense Yoav Gallant, who visited Washington last week and held talks with US officials including National Security Advisor Jake Sullivan and Secretary of Defence Lloyd Austin, a second source said. Biden faces pressure from foreign partners, human rights groups and some of his fellow Democrats in Congress to impose conditions on arms transfers to rein in Israel's offensive in Gaza where health officials say at least 32,845 Palestinians have been killed, many of them civilians.

Israel aerospace, aerorotor unmanned systems forge partnership to develop tactical drone system

Under the terms of the agreement, the partnership will focus on engineering development and marketing initiatives to enhance the capabilities of the Apus multicopter. This includes optimizing its performance for various tactical military operations on land, at sea, and in the air.

Israel deploys C-Dome defence system for first time

Israel for the first time deployed its shipmounted defence system, called the C-Dome, against a "suspicious" target that entered the country's airspace near the southern city of Eilat, the military said. The C-Dome is a naval version of the Iron Dome air defence system used to shield against rocket and missile attacks. The Israel Defence Forces (IDF) reported an alert in the area of Eilat, which was targeted in February by intercepted ballistic missile fire from Yemen's Houthi rebels, allies of Palestinian militants Hamas. "Following the sirens that sounded in the area of Eilat regarding the infiltration of a hostile aircraft, IDF Naval forces identified a suspicious aerial target crossing into Israeli territory," the IDF said in a statement released. "The target was successfully intercepted by the C-Dome naval defence system," it said. No injuries or damage were reported.

Jordan air force shoots down Iranian drones flying over to Israel

Jordan's air force intercepted and shot down dozens of Iranian drones that violated its airspace and were heading to Israel, two regional security sources said. They said the army was also in a state of high alert and radar systems were monitoring any drone activity coming from the direction of Iraq and Syria. "The relevant authorities took the decision to close the airspace for precautionary reasons as a result of the surrounding security situation," Jordan's spokesperson government Muhannad Mubaideen denied media reports that the kingdom had announced a state of emergency, adding there was no cause for concern among its citizens. neighbors Syria and Iraq – both countries where Iranian proxy forces operate - and also is next door to Israel and the Israelioccupied West Bank.

Qatar and Kuwait prohibit US from using its air bases, airspace for strikes on Iran

Lebanon

Lebanon accepts additional land rover spare parts from UK

The UK has delivered additional Land Rover armored patrol spare parts to Lebanon as part of London's Conflict, Stability, and Security Fund (CSSF) program. The package, shipped to a logistics base in Kfarshima, included 737 tires, 225 engines, and other critical Land Rover components worth 2 million pounds (\$2.5 million). London wrote that this donation would be used for repairs, maintenance, and other servicing needs for more than 440 military vehicles under the Lebanese Armed Forces. The government added that the package will improve the military's mobility, road safety, and operational readiness, particularly the Land Border Regiments. "The UK reaffirms its commitment to supporting the [Lebanese Armed Forces] and to strengthening Lebanon's security and stability."

Lebanon's Hezbollah fires 'dozens of rockets' at Israeli positions

Hezbollah said it has fired "dozens of rockets" at Israeli artillery positions in response to the Israeli military's strikes in southern Lebanon, in one of its largest assaults since the start of the war on Gaza. The Iran-aligned armed Lebanese group confirmed in a statement late on Friday that it launched dozens of Katyusha rockets at "enemy artillery positions" in northern Israel and the occupied Golan Heights. The rockets triggered sirens in multiple communities across Upper Galilee in northern Israel, with air defence missiles engaging the incoming projectiles. The Israeli military said "40 launches were identified from Lebanese territory, some of which were intercepted. The rest fell in open areas."

Oman shows interest in Dassault Rafale Jets

Oman has reportedly expressed a keen interest in procuring Dassault Rafale jets, marking a potential departure from its existing fleet dominated by American aircraft and Eurofighter Typhoons. Sources close to the matter revealed to French publication LA Tribune that Oman, nestled along the Arabian Sea with Yemen as its neighbor, has initiated discussions regarding the acquisition of Rafale combat aircraft. Dassault Aviation is reportedly cautiously optimistic about the prospects, acknowledging ongoing dialogues with Omani authorities. With a focus on securing orders of modest size, ranging between 12 18 aircraft. Dassault aims supplement existing delivery commitments, including substantial

contracts with the United Arab Emirates (80), France (42), Indonesia (42), and potentially Saudi Arabia. Oman's military fleet currently includes American aircraft alongside the Typhoon.

Gaza infrastructure damages estimated at \$18.5bn in UN-World Bank report

The cost of damage to critical infrastructure in the first four months of Israel's continuing war on Gaza is estimated at about \$18.5bn, a new report by the World Bank and the United Nations has found. The report estimated that the damage was equivalent to 97 percent of the combined GDP of the occupied West Bank and Gaza in 2022. The continuing conflict has damaged or destroyed approximately 62 percent of all homes in Gaza, equivalent to 290,820 housing units, and more than a million people are without homes. Housing accounts for 72 percent of the total damage

costs, at an estimated value of \$13.3bn. The education system has collapsed, with all of Gaza's 625,000 students out of school.

Netanyahu says Israeli forces killed World Central Kitchen workers in Gaza

Israel has confirmed its forces killed seven people from the World Central Kitchen charity in Gaza as they travelled in a convoy emblazoned with the charity's logo that had coordinated its movements with the Israeli Prime Minister military. Benjamin Netanyahu described the deadly attack on the aid workers as unintended and "tragic" and pledged an independent inquiry. "Unfortunately in the past day, there was a tragic event in which our forces unintentionally harmed non-combatants in the Gaza Strip," Netanyahu said in a video statement. "This happens in war. We are conducting a thorough inquiry and are in contact with the governments. We will do everything to prevent a recurrence." the United Citizens from Australia, and Poland, Kingdom as well Palestinians and a dual citizen of the United States and Canada were killed.

War on journalists – Israeli attack targets reporters in nuseirat

Qatar energy expands LNG fleet with deals for 19 new vessels

Qatar Energy has signed long-term time charter party (TCP) agreements with four international ship owners for the operation of 19 ultra-modern conventional-size LNG vessels, which comes as part of the second ship-owner tender under the organisation's historic LNG fleet expansion programme. The event witnessed agreements catering for the operation of six vessels by CMES LNG Carrier Investment Inc., six vessels by Shandong Marine Energy (Singapore) Pte Ltd., and three vessels by MISC Berhad; all of which are being constructed at Samsung Heavy Industries in South Korea. The remaining four vessels will be operated by a joint venture of Kawasaki Kisen Kaisha Ltd. (K-Line) and Hyundai Glovis Co. Ltd. and are being constructed at Hanwha Ocean (formerly Daewoo Shipbuilding & Marine Engineering) in South Korea.

Israeli parliament passes law paving the way for Al-Jazeera closure

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has promised to "act immediately to stop" Al- Jazeera's operations in the country after the Israeli parliament approved a law that grants senior ministers powers to shut down foreign news networks deemed a security risk. "Al-Jazeera harmed Israel's security, actively participated in the October 7

massacre, and incited against Israeli soldiers," Netanyahu wrote on X. The law, which passed in a 71-10 vote in the Knesset, gives the prime minister and communications minister the authority to order the closure of foreign networks operating in Israel and confiscate their equipment if it is believed they pose "harm to the state's security".

US military says it destroyed dozens of drones fired from Iran, Yemen
